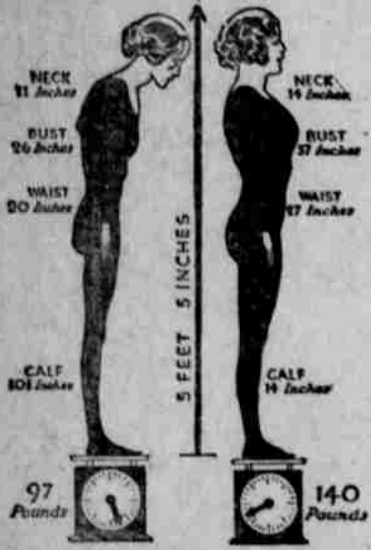

NEW PAPAL HEAD NOT YET SETTLED DOWN TO ROUTINE

ROME, Feb. 17.—(By Associated Press.) Pius XI has not yet settled down to the normal life of a supreme pontiff, chiefly because the private apartment occupied by the late Benedict XV is not yet ready to receive him. A crowd of workmen is still re-decorating the apartment, changing the hangings and carpets and re-arranging the furniture.

Meanwhile the pope sleeps in what is called the "little throne room." It is in this chamber that Pope Leo XIII died.

The throne has been removed, being replaced by the small iron bed in which Pius sleeps. This is sheltered by a screen and in another part of the room is a large desk at which the pope works and where he daily receives vatican officials.

In order to save time he takes his meals in the large papal library adjoining, being served on his predecessor's desk.

Pius has had little time for exercise and thus far has only been able to walk through vatican gardens once.

HIGH SPOTS SOUGHT MARY'S WEDDING

LONDON, Feb. 17.—It will cost some persons who can afford to pay it the equivalent of \$75 or more for a glimpse of the royal processions between Buckingham palace and Westminster Abbey on the day of Princess Mary's wedding, February 23. Bidding for seats at windows or on the roofs of buildings flanking the processional route, about a mile in length, is progressing briskly. The vantage points most coveted are those about Parliament Square adjacent to Westminster Abbey as they offer the best view.

MOUNT IDA, A. P., Feb. 17.—The Rev. Harding Hughes, superannuated minister, charged with murder in connection with the death of Mrs. Anna McKennon last May was found guilty by a jury early today. His punishment was fixed at life imprisonment.

LABOR HARD HIT BY OPERATION OF U. S. DISARMAMENT

WASHINGTON, Feb. 17.—Establishment of government employment service within the navy department to facilitate the re-employment of labor released through operation of the naval limitation treaty was recommended to Secretary Denby today by Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor and a committee representing navy yard workers.

The delegation also suggested that the work of scrapping ships be eliminated under the naval treaty be assigned to navy yards and be commenced on ratification of the treaty.

Secretary Denby promised to give the proposals his earliest attention.

In presenting the case of the workers, President Gompers emphasized that organized labor supported fully the purposes and results of the arms limitation conference.

Mr. Gompers said, however, that the suspension order came "from a clear sky" and that men who had worked continuously in the yards for nearly thirty years were furloughed with no more than seven or eight minutes' notice.

VIRGINIA'S NURSE ARBUCKLE WITNESS

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 17.—Miss Virginia Warren of Chicago, one time nurse of Virginia Rappe, film actress, is in San Francisco, and there is considerable speculation over whether she will be called to the stand at the third trial of Roscoe Arbuckle beginning March 13, on a manslaughter charge resulting from the death of Miss Rappe. Miss Warren is said to have attended Miss Rappe during an illness in Chicago and a deposition obtained from her by the defense was not used in the previous Arbuckle trials, both of which resulted in jury disagreements.

The state announced today a jury panel of 250 names would be drawn Friday for the third trial.

NEW YORK, Feb. 16.—Tex Rickard, fight promoter today was indicted for criminal assault on two minor girls by the supreme court grand jury.
