Standard Oil of New Jersey and California, Pierce Oil preferred, Houston Oil and Mexican and Pan American Petroleum rose one to three points. American and Baldwin Locomotives, American Car, Bethlehem Steel, Mercantile Marine preferred, American Ship and Commerce, Cuba Cane Sugar preferred, People's Gas and Colorado Fuel were 1 to almost 2 points higher. Rock Island featured the rails, rising two points. American Smelting Tobacco preferred lost 1 1/2 points on suspension of the dividend and American Writing Paper preferred was weakest of the specialties. The closing was strong.
