DIRECTOR WAR RISK INSURANCE DEAD, UNDER 40

NEW YORK, Feb. 21.—Colonel R. G. Cholmeley-Jones, formerly director of the bureau of war risk insurance, died at the Presbyterian hospital early today. He had been ill since October 30 last.

Colonel Cholmeley-Jones who was 38 years of age, was twice rejected for military service during the war, but the government, recognizing his ability as an organizer gave him a captain's commission in the adjutant general's department and sent him overseas with the war risk section. He became chief of the war risk bureau in the American expeditionary force, remaining in France until 1919.
