**ROSEBURG TEAM ARRIVES, GAME ASHLAND TONIGHT**

"Dad" King and his squad of Roseburg hoopers arrived in this city last evening by auto and registered at the Hotel Medford. The northerners meet Ashland tonight at Ashland and Medford tomorrow night at the Nat.

"Dad" says his team is light, they average only 134 pounds, but that they are fast and full of real spirit and fight. Several of his best men are on the sick list with colds at present and one of the best men on the team, was left at home because of illness. Despite this handicap, however, he says they are ready to fight to the last ditch and win if they can.

The Roseburg team played thirteen games without a defeat and intend to hang onto their good record and remain undefeated if it takes the last little kick that is in them.

The Ashland team is confident of victory despite the defeat at Roseburg and Coach Hughes of Ashland has all his men well drilled on the "Touch System" of basketball, which is more easily picked up on the Ashland high school floor than other floors. Ashland has long been the strongest exponent of the touch system in southern Oregon, all lights being turned out in the gym during practice hours and the majority of the team throwing baskets with eyes closed, especially on moonlight nights when a stray ray of light enters the gym.

The game is expected to be a close contest although the Roseburg boys will not have a chance to show their speed on the Ashland floor because of limited space.

In tomorrow night's contest a real exhibition of basketball is the prospect. With the great improvement which has taken place in the Medford team since the northern tour, the locals should be a match for the northerners in everything, including fight and spirit.

Reserved seats for the game went on sale at Crowson's this morning and from the way they are selling a record crowd is expected.

**GRAND JURY TO MAKE ITS REPORT TOMORROW A. M.**

The grand jury will complete its work, and make a report on general conditions and the Bank of Jacksonville today, according to expectations. No new indictments were brought in today, and the body is expected to file its report this afternoon. A new grand jury will be drawn Monday for the year.

A number of witnesses were called before the grand jury this morning including Ad Helms and others of the Kingsbury Springs district. The nature of their information was not divulged.

It is expected that the grand jury will file a comprehensive report on the Bank of Jacksonville failure, explaining the various phases of the affair, as they have found it, so the public will understand it. The state bank examiner a few weeks ago promised a report to the depositors, after L. Neidermyer had written him a letter, but as yet it has not appeared.

**CLAIMS CHINAMAN, WOMAN AND TWO MEN KILLED TAYLOR**

DETROIT, Mich., Feb. 23.—Inclined to doubt the story of Harry M. Fields, a prisoner in the county jail here, that he was implicated in the slaying of William D. Taylor, Los Angeles motion picture director, local authorities today were endeavoring to trace his movements immediately preceding his arrest in Buffalo, February 6. Fields was arrested in Buffalo on a charge of forgery here.

Last night he told officers he had driven two men, one of them a Chinese, and a woman to Taylor's home on the night of the killing, and that he had received \$300 for his work.

Fields asserted that after the party dispersed he went to Kansas City, where he purchased new clothing and then proceeded to Buffalo. At the time of his arrest there he wore a suit purchased in Kansas City, but the authorities profess to have reason to believe Fields was either in New York City or in Buffalo at the time of the Taylor slaying.

NEW YORK, Feb. 23.—Harry M. Fields, a prisoner of the Detroit police, who claims he can furnish leading clues in the William D. Taylor murder at Los Angeles, February 1, has a long record here as a drug peddler, pickpocket and stool pigeon for federal authorities, it was revealed today by Narcotic Agent Ralph Oiler.

Mr. Oiler caused Field's arrest at Buffalo last February 6 and sent him to Detroit where he was wanted on a forgery charge.

Fields came to New York from the Pacific coast.

**CALIF-OREGON CO. GIVES GOLD HILL CO. \$40,000 ORDER**

The California Oregon Power company, has placed an order with the Gold Hill Cement company for 10,000 barrels of their product. This is approximately a \$40,000 purchase and will require some fifty Southern Pacific freight cars to deliver the same at Thrall, Calif., where it goes over the power company's 14 mile railroad to Copar, where they are installing the second 12,500 KW unit, which has been on the ground for some time, also raising the crest of their dam across the Klamath river to its full height of 130 feet above the former water level.

The making of the cement for this order is now under way, the cement company having started up a few days ago and is now running full blast with prospects for a very busy season.
