JAPAN HALTS WORK ON FORTIFICATIONS

TOKIO, Feb. 27.—By the Associated Press.—The foreign office announced today that the Japanese government had decided to discontinue forthwith the work on fortifications in the Bonin and Amami Oshima Islands and to maintain the existing fortifications and naval base at Formosa and the Pescadores. Orders have been issued to carry out this decision in conformity with decisions reached at the Washington conference.
