COACH BOHLER TO REMAIN U. OF O.

EUGENE, Ore., Mar. 1.—Coach John M. Bohler will remain head of the University of Oregon basketball and baseball as a result of an understanding reached at a conference following his recent declaration that he would no longer work as a member of the staff of the school of education. "I have attempted at all times to be loyal to Dean Howard and the charges of disloyalty against me and the misunderstanding on my part has been due to the influence of outsiders," he said.

Dean John Howard said he was anxious that Coach Bohler be retained as coach here and that he was highly pleased with his work as a coach.

Ordinance No. 1294. AN ORDINANCE prohibiting all persons under seventeen years of age from being on the streets, alleys and other public places in the City of Medford after certain hours at night.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of seventeen years of age to be upon, loiter, wander or stroll about the streets, alleys, avenues, parks or public places of the City of Medford, Oregon, after the hour of 9:30 p. m. from and including October 1st in any year to and including March 31st of the following year and after 10 p. m. from and including April 1st until and including September 30th in any year unless such person shall be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or other adult person lawfully and properly accompanying such person, excepting and in case of any person within the age of 15 to 17 years of age who is attending any school, or public function or similar nature, in the evening, such time limit as provided in this section for being upon the streets, alleys, avenues, parks or other public places shall for such persons within the age of 15 to 17 years actually attending such functions be extended to one hour later and no more.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police of the City of Medford to have the fire whistle or fire bell of said city blown or rung regularly every day fifteen minutes before the hours, after which it shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 17 years to loiter, wander, stroll or be upon the streets, alleys, avenues, parks or public places of the city of Medford as provided in Section 1 of this ordinance, but such signal shall only be given for the regular hours as provided in Section 1 of this ordinance and not for any extended hours. The signal provided for in this section shall be known as the curfew signal and shall be regarded by all persons as a signal and warning to observe the terms of this ordinance.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian or other adult having the legal care and custody of any person under the age of 17 years to allow or permit any such person to go upon or be in or upon the streets, alleys, avenues, parks or other public places within the corporate limits of the city of Medford after the hours designated in Section 1 of this ordinance except as provided by section one hereof.

Section 4. Any policeman, police officer, or peace officer is hereby authorized and empowered by virtue of his office to take charge of any person under the age of 17 years, violating the provisions of this ordinance and for the first violation thereof it shall be the duty of such policeman or other officer taking charge of any such person to take the said person to his home and also to notify the parents or guardians of the terms of this ordinance. Upon a second or further violation of this ordinance said parents or guardians or those having charge of such person shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall upon conviction thereof before the City Court be fined not less than \$2.00 nor more than \$25.00 for each and every offense.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
