## Cheboygan to Rebuild, Death List Growing

CHEBOYGAN, Mich., Mar. 9.—Business interests of Cheboygan were today considering plans to rebuild the city's business district, four blocks of which were destroyed Wednesday.

While these plans were under consideration city firemen continued to dig among the embers in a search for bodies of two missing boys.

The known dead still stood at three, a man and two boys whose bodies were recovered late yesterday.

State troops are aiding local authorities in maintaining order.

The loss in the fire is estimated at more than \$500,000.
