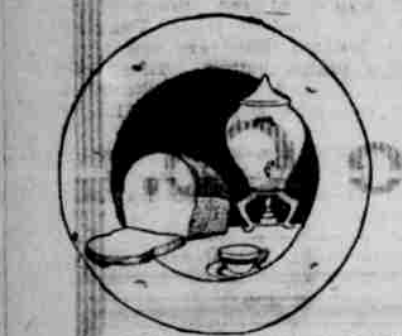

Jewish colonists from Persia have also set up a number of factories, which make carpets, patterns for foreign consumption. The United States is their chief buyer for the present.
