DENIES APPLE INDUSTRY N. W. IS ON DECLINE

WENATCHEE, Wash., Mar. 16.—P. S. Darlington, district horticultural inspector for the Wenatchee district also takes issue with S. W. Fletcher of Pennsylvania State college relative to the apple industry in Washington having reached its peak. Mr. Darlington said:

The statement made by Professor Fletcher that the state of Washington has reached its zenith in apple production is not apparently based on the close first hand knowledge concerning the industry in this state.

"The big rapid development of orchard lands and the planting in this state was from 1907 to 1912. This year 1912 was a bad apple market year and the period from 1912 to 1915 inclusive was a period of depression in the apple industry of this state. During this period very few new orchards were planted and some old ones were abandoned. The period from 1915 to 1921 inclusive, has been a period of prosperity for the apple industry of Washington and the planting of new orchards has been on the increase during that period. There will be a larger acreage planted to apples in this state this spring than has been the case in any year since 1912. So long as the apple industry remains prosperous there will be heavy planting."
