

### 'K. K. K.' IN FULL REGALIA AGAIN VISIT PASTOR

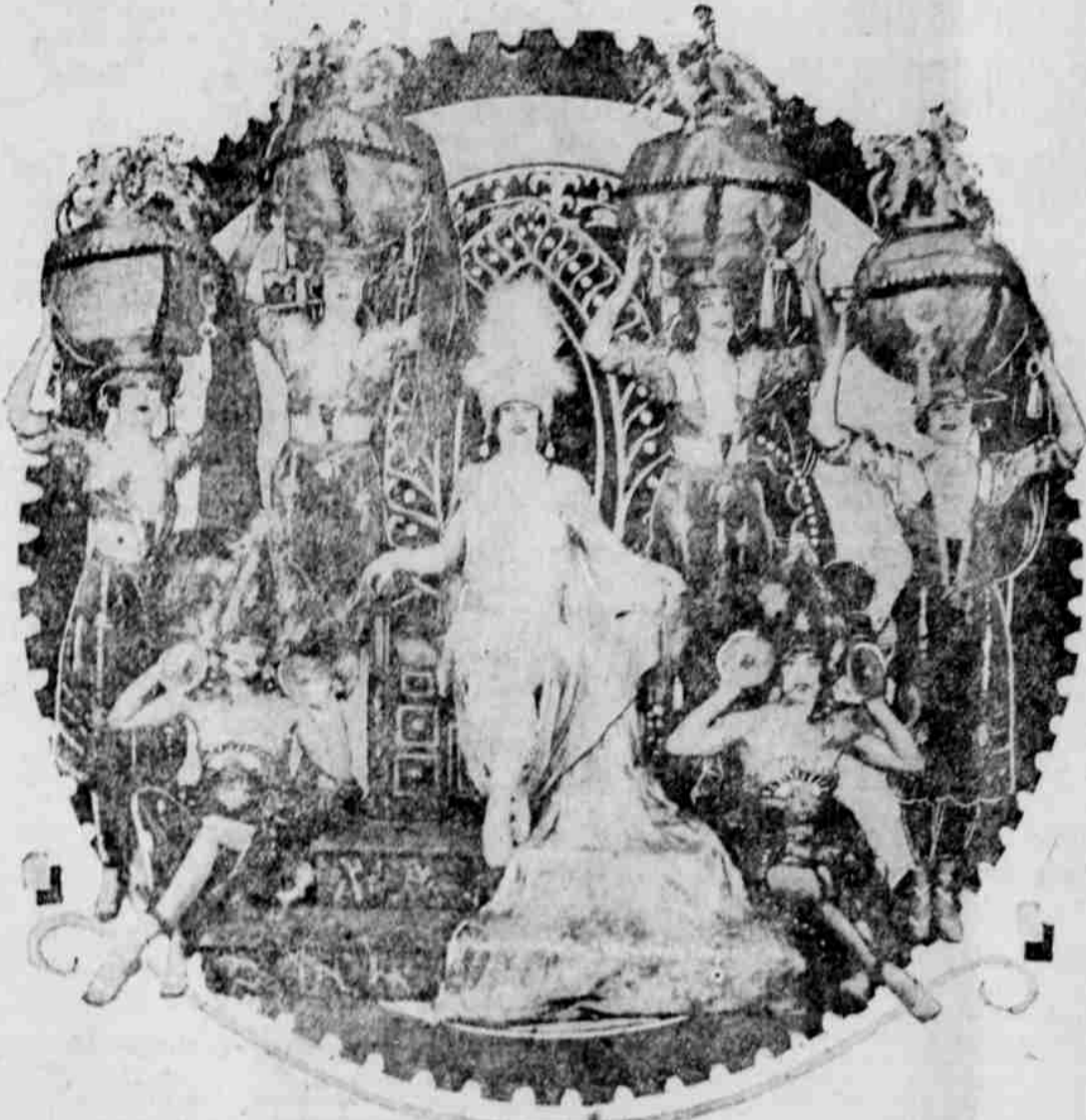

Mr. Fenton opened the envelope and found the following invitation: "Mr. and Mrs. Fenton, dear friends: You are cordially invited to attend a taffy pull, to be given at 25 North Oakdale this evening.

"Kute Kandy Kids." Mr. Fenton had been invited, it seemed, to attend a function at his own home, and, furthermore, a festivity of which he had not yet heard a word. The K.K.K.'s turned out to be three young girls, members of Mr. Fenton's congregation. Mr. and Mrs. Fenton rifled the envelopes, obtained the necessary ingredients for the construction of taffy sufficiently sticky to furnish the hardest kind of a struggle in the pulling, and started the boiling process. The remainder of the evening was spent in pulling the taffy and puzzling over the different methods of letting go of it. Finally a successful method of detachment was hit upon, namely, transferring the taffy from the hands to the digestive tract. ### OREGON GUARDS TO TRAIN AT CAMPS IN WASHINGTON

SEATTLE, Mar. 21.—More than 5000 National Guardsmen from Oregon, Utah, Idaho and Washington will receive instruction at Camps Murray and Lewis and Fort Worden, Wash., during the coming summer, according to a tentative schedule forwarded from headquarters of the ninth corps area at San Francisco to Brigadier General Maurice Thompson, adjutant general of Washington. The encampments of the various contingents will be held between July 9 and 23.

Troops to be trained at Camp Lewis under the tentative schedule include Company A, 116th combat engineers and 146th hospital company, 162nd infantry, first battalion of 168th infantry, battery A, 148th field artillery, Idaho National guard; first battalion 145th field artillery with medical detachment, Utah National Guard; 146th field artillery, battery A, corps artillery, Washington National guard.

Companies 483, 484, 485 and 486, coast artillery, O. N. G., will receive instruction at Fort Worden as will the coast artillery companies of the W. N. G.

The following Washington guardsmen will encamp at Camp Murray: 161st infantry, troops B, 58th machine gun squadron and 116th ambulance company.

Chivenger, an employee of the bond department of the treasury, already in custody, in connection with the robbery, secret service officials said.
