PALATIAL HOTEL IN NASSAU BURNS

MIAMI, Fla., Mar. 31.—The 300 room Colonial hotel at Nassau in the Bahama Islands was destroyed today in a fire which for a time threatened the destruction of most of the city, according to radio messages received here. The conflagration was controlled, however, after it had caused damage running into millions of dollars.

The hotel, one of the chain owned and operated by the Florida East Coast Hotel company, and a number of cottages nearby were burned to the ground. There were no casualties. The number of guests in the hotel was believed to be small as the tourist season is near its close. The Colonial, a frame structure, was built about twenty years ago.

Bishop Sumner Says Jazz Regime Over

PORTLAND, Ore., March 31.—Home last night from the east, where he spent four weeks investigating church heads, laying preliminary plans for the general Episcopal conference to be held here in September and giving a series of Lenten addresses in New York City, Bishop Walter Taylor Sumner of the Episcopal diocese of Oregon brought with him vivid impressions of a wonderful spiritual revival throughout the country.

"There is no question about it," declared Bishop Sumner. "Laymen as well as church men told me of it and it was most impressive. Our young people, it appears, have run the race of unconventionality and they now see the vulgarity of it. There is a remarkable reversion to the more decent type of action."

FOR GOVT. CONTROL OF MUSCLE SHOALS

WASHINGTON, Mar. 31.—Commencement of work to complete the Wilson dam and construct dam No. 2 at Muscle Shoals, Ala., under government appropriation and supervision will be proposed to the senate, Chairman Norris of the agriculture committee announced on his return from an inspection of Alabama properties in company with other senators and members of the house military committee.

A study of the nitrate plants at Sheffield, Senator Norris added, and of the power potentialities for their operation had "somewhat shattered" his hopes of producing cheaper fertilizers there because the plants were too expensive to operate for fertilizer production.
