WATER AWARDED TO MINING CO. ON APPEAL

SALEM, April 6.—(Special.)—During the months of January, February and March, 74 permits have been issued by State Engineer Percy A. Cupper, for the appropriation of water from streams throughout the state of Oregon. The permits cover the irrigation of 19,160 acres of land, the development of 1893 horsepower, and the use of water for mining, municipal, domestic, and various other purposes. The estimated cost of construction work under the permits is approximately \$213,000. During this period, four permits to construct reservoirs for the storage of 741 acre feet of water were issued, and the estimated cost of construction work is \$13,000.

Among the more important permits issued are the following: By the City of Milton, for the appropriation of water from the Walla Walla river for development of 1770 horsepower. This development will cover the construction of a pipe line two and one-half miles in length, and a power house, but no estimate of cost was given.

To the Shelvin-Hixon company of Bend, for the appropriation of water from Paulina Creek for log pond, domestic use, and for use in steam boilers. The estimated cost of construction is \$12,000. To the Big Four Mining company of Applegate, Oregon, covering the appropriation of water from North Fork of Steamboat creek for development of 25 horsepower, and for mining purposes in Josephine county. The estimated construction cost is \$5,000.

HEAVY SNOWSTORM CASPER, WYOMING

CASPER, Wyo., April 6.—The heaviest snow storm of the winter was in progress in central Wyoming early today but the temperature had barely reached the freezing mark and there was no suffering among range stock. The equivalent of an inch and a half of water fell in rain and snow yesterday and last night and snow lay to a depth of about one foot this morning with heavy fall coating.
