ONCE more an armed band of unknown citizens have taken the law into their own hands in Jackson County. We wonder why?

We have a certain organization devoted to 100 per cent Americanism which includes, we assume, the upholding of the Constitution of the United States.

The Constitution declares in the 6th, 7th and 8th amendments:

"No person shall be held to answer for a capital or other infamous crime unless on presentment or indictment of a grand jury.

In all criminal prosecutions the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial by an impartial jury of the state and district wherein the crime shall have been committed.

"In suits at common law where the value in controversy shall exceed \$20, the right of trial by jury shall be preserved."

Why is it that this organization, devoted to law and order and 100 per cent Americanism, should take so little interest in violations of our fundamental law as written by our forefathers?
