## LA FOLLETTE IN ATTACK, BACKED BY JOE DANIELS

WASHINGTON, April 21.—Complete information regarding the leasing of rights in naval oil reserves was sought in a resolution introduced today by Senator LaFollette, Republican, Wisconsin, who at the same time made public a letter from Josephus Daniels, former secretary of the navy, opposing the leasing of the government domain. 28\*

Mr. Daniels said in his letter that when the first claims for lease rights on naval reserves were examined by the navy department it was found that they were asked for by parties working in the stock yards of Chicago, who thought they were signing a petition for an election. 28\*

Senator LaFollette's resolution calls for all documents and correspondence between the president, the navy and interior departments and lessees on the naval reserve, including those in California as well as Wyoming. 28\*

Discussion of the resolution was deferred at Senator LaFollette's request. 28\*

Former Secretary Daniels' letter said that all during his administration he had fought leasing for the naval reserves. 28\*

## EVEN COCKROACH IS RADIO FAN, SAYS SERGEANT

HARRISBURG, Pa., April 15.—The troublesome cockroach is a "radio fan" and communicates by wireless with his brothers and sisters, Howard Zimmerman, a Harrisburg sergeant major in the Pennsylvania National Guard believes, and he seeks to prove it by experiments, the results of which were made public today. 28\*

In a bug infested barracks in Luxembourg, under the direction of Captain Armstrong of the Fifth division, signal corps, with which Sergeant Zimmerman was serving shortly after the armistice, the discovery came in the natural order of events. 28\*

"We were having night radio school and were working on the shortest possible wave length," the sergeant explained. "The sets were three feet apart on a glass top table. 28\*

"One night everything was working perfectly when suddenly our tubes began to act queerly. By the flickering light of the candle we located a cockroach between the receiving and transmitting apparatus. We removed him and to our surprise the operation again became normal. This led to further experiments, which established our conclusions." 28\*

## PEKIN IS TAKEN OVER BY GOVERNOR OF MANCHURIA

PEKING, April 21.—(By Associated Press.) The troops of General Chang Tso-Lin, governor of Manchuria, today took possession of Peking and Tien Tsin, replacing the local police forces of those cities. The transfer of authority was devoid of incident. 28\*

The only sign of hostility between Chang Tso-Lin and General Wu Pei-Fu commander of Central China forces was the cutting of the Peking-Fukow railroad at a point south of Tien Tsin which caused inconvenience to a number of American travelers enroute to Shanghai. 28\*
