

### COUNTY WILL TRY TO CUT EXPENSES DRY ENFORCEMENT

According to figures submitted by the county treasurer, warrants issued and payable to R. H. Sanderfer, prohibition enforcement officer, total \$3,069.95. This amount does not include warrants issued to A. H. Gates and others engaged in collecting evidence, and covers the period from last August to May 1st.

The books of the county clerk show that vouchers for warrants totaling \$2198.61 were issued for prohibition enforcement in this county, distributed as follows by months this year, were:
