LEGION LEADER THAT HE WASN'T MEMBER K. K. K.

FRESNO, Cal., May 10.—In a statement to representatives of the Fresno Morning Republican today, John R. Quinn, state commander of the American Legion, whose name was found on Klan records revealed at Bakersfield, said he joined the organization last summer. For nearly a year, he said, he had been under the impression that his name had been dropped, since he had attended but one meeting, had paid no dues and taken no part in Klan activities. The Legion leader said he had signed the application blank because the organization was represented to him to foster the same high ideals as the American Legion. His statement follows: "During the summer of 1921 I was invited to become a member of the Ku Klux Klan. The organization was at that time openly soliciting members and represented the purpose of the order to be the furtherment of law and order and the development of 100 per cent Americanism. "Devoted as I was to the promotion of the ideals of Americanism as taught by the American Legion I was more than willing to aid any organization actuated by such motives. I was asked to attend and did attend a meeting in a public hall in the city of Bakersfield and signed a card, but did not perfect membership. "This card, I presume, is the foundation for the assumption that I am a member of the Ku Klux Klan. Since that time I have attended no meetings of the organization, have never discussed its business with any of its members and have paid no dues of any kind to it. I have never considered myself a member of the Ku Klux Klan and if it is responsible for the recent acts of lawlessness and stands for the un-American principles attributed to it by the press and by statements of the various district attorneys of the state, I, in common with all law-abiding citizens, must be opposed to it."
