Tunney-Greb Match Tonight NEW YORK, May 23.—The American lightweight championship title will be at stake tonight when Champion Gene Tunney of New York and Harry Greb of Pittsburg, challenger, meet over the fifteen round trail at Madison Square Garden tonight. Tunney won the American crown from battling Levinsky last January. Levinsky lost the world's title to Georges

The waiters complained that, in spite of the fact that their tips have fallen off fifty per cent during the past year, the proprietors propose a wage cut ranging from 25 to 50 per cent.
