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ASHLAND SHRINE WILL ATTEND BIG MEDFORD MEETING

ASHLAND, May 24.—"Why is a camel?" This interrogatory will be replied to, figuratively speaking at least, at Medford, on Friday, May 26, incident to the Shrine doings under auspices of Hilaria Temple. The business session and first section will begin at 2 p. m., followed by parade from the Nat to Medford Hotel about 4:30, where nobles will "select their partners for the traditional banquet at six o'clock. There will be no formal speeches at the banquet, merely the music of social chatter, both real and instrumental. The parade committee includes J. F. Lawrence, chairman; George Gates, J. P. Hutton, Raymond Reter and George R. Chapman. Following precedent, there will be a dance at the Nat after the ceremonial, a seven-piece orchestra having been engaged. Opportunity, the circus and menagerie, booked for Medford on May 29, should have anticipated that date by appearing there on May 26, thus not only helping out the Shrine parade, but also avoiding the criticism which it is causing by holding a show on Decoration Day.

Rev. Joseph Knotts of Grants Pass, preached in the Methodist church last Sunday morning, the pastor being away at Klamath Falls.

Funeral services of the late Mrs. Sarah Stamp, of Talent, were held at the Brethren church in Ashland, on Sunday, afternoon being in Mountain View cemetery.

Beginning on Monday, the current week will be an eventful one. On that date there was a big gathering of Modern Woodmen at Moose Hall, also Ku Klux Klan lecture and pictures at the Vining. On Tuesday afternoon the Eastern Star embroidery club met in regular session, the Masonic lodge also being presided over by its past-masters in the evening at a special meeting. Chautauqua began on Wednesday, the assembly to continue until the 29th. Thursday is high school graduation day, the exercises to take place at the armory in the evening. On Friday there will be an exodus to the Shrine ceremonial doings at Medford, while Saturday will witness a big crowd in Ashland incident to the observance here this year of Jackson county school day. Trending upon the forthcoming week, Chautauqua always stresses a great union religious service in the auditorium on Sunday, which some think is in a measure offset by the circus which is to appear in Ashland on Monday, May 29. Reverting to Tuesday, there was the customary Chamber of Commerce forum luncheon at Hotel Ashland on that date, the dining event being followed by an auto trip of inspection to the granite quarries in this vicinity. And furthermore we must not overlook Bunkle Day for Near East relief, which took place on Wednesday.

J. L. Corbett, of the mine bearing his name over in Shoshone county near Hilt, has been in town of late, stocking up with supplies for the ensuing season. Mrs. Corbett has been visiting relatives in Walla Walla, Wash.

Mrs. George E. Whitman of Medford, returned missionary from China, was in Ashland on Wednesday, addressing a gathering at the Baptist church on matters pertaining to the evangelization of the teeming population of the far east. She plans to return there in the early fall, the territory being southern China, in the vicinity of Kiating, with Swatow as a base of influence.

Mr. and Mrs. A. E. Kinney started for central California on Tuesday, utilizing the family car as a conveyance, the trip to be leisurely made with Oakland as the objective point. Their stay will be indefinite, but will be prolonged in any event until after the Shrine gathering in San Francisco.

Jerome and Chapman, Medford capitalists, were in town on Tuesday, superintending the shipment of a lot of Shrine equipment to the county metropolis, for the ceremonial event on Friday this week.

Mrs. Kathryn Miller Umphlett was the guest of honor on Wednesday of this week, at a picnic party in the park, attended by Eastern Star friends, who decided to spend the partying guest to her new home in the Willamette, in the way of a friendly reunion of old-time acquaintances, these friendships being doubly cemented through pleasant affiliations in both school and fraternity channels. Junior high will miss an efficient teacher, and Alpha Chapter loses also an efficient co-worker in the departure of Mrs. Umphlett from the old familiar educational and society surroundings here.

W. E. Glendenning, formerly stationed here in the government forest service, has lately been assigned to the important position of assistant state forester, in charge of all tree planting activities throughout California, and this is "some territory." He receives a substantial increase of salary, and is also furnished a car, with all incidental expenses paid. His headquarters, until further notice, will remain at Chico, where he has been located for some time past.

"Two Horsemen of the Apocalypse" wandered up and down the streets Monday afternoon, scattering bills heralding the address on the Ku Klux Klan as delivered by Dr. R. H. ASK MERCHANTS TO DECORATE FOR SHRINE CEREMONY

Much difficulty was encountered by the committee in securing the consent of Emil Mohr, proprietor of the Hotel Medford, but after assurances had been given him exempting him from all liability he reluctantly acquiesced, and granted his permission.

CALL FOR BIDS ON BUTTE FALLS ROAD

The regular session of the county court was held this morning, and county road matters occupied the attention of the body. Arrangements were made for the calling of bids for the improvement and construction of the Derby-Butte Falls road, which has been under consideration for several months, and will be completed in time for winter travel. 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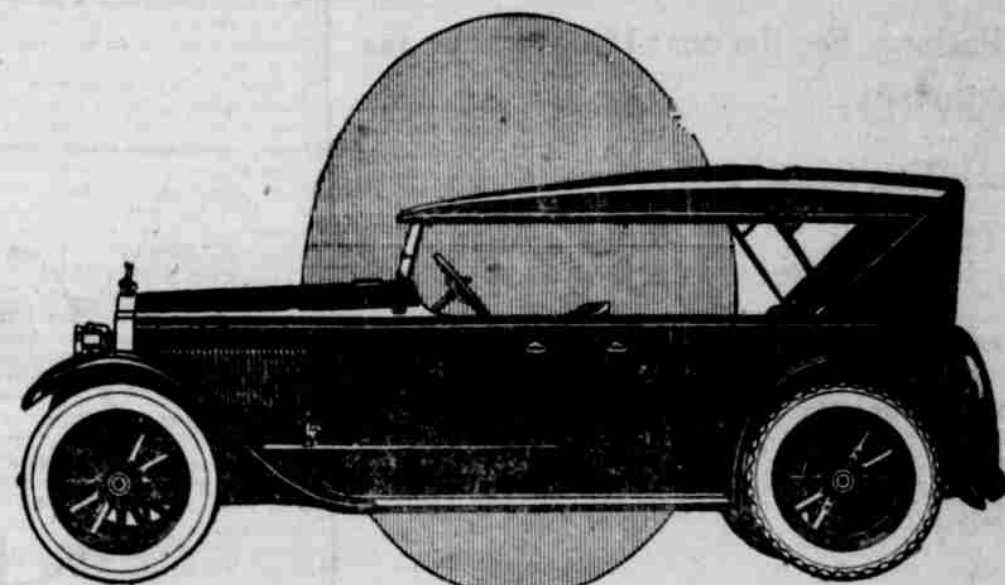
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
