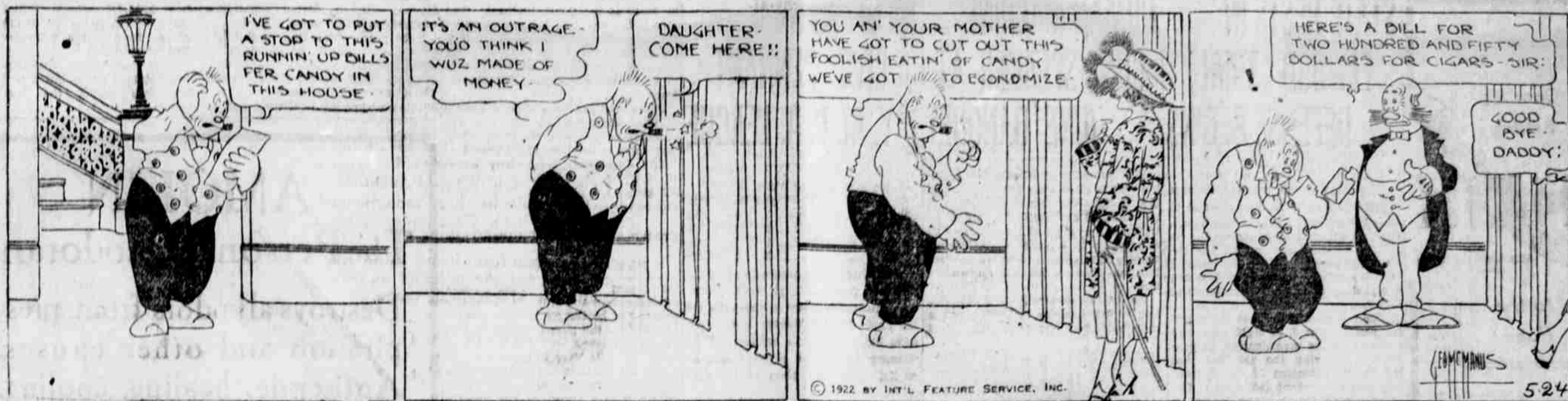

BEST GRANITE IN COUNTRY IS FOUND ASHLAND QUARRY

E. V. Carter of Ashland was the principal speaker at the Chamber of Commerce forum at the Hotel Medford this noon and outlined and explained the plan of re-financing and reorganizing the granite quarry near Ashland. The quarry has been in charge of Mr. Blair of Ashland for the past seven years and he has spent all of his time and a considerable amount of money in developing it. During these years the Ashland granite has become known to Pacific coast dealers as one of the finest grades of granite procurable anywhere. It has not been widely used because of the difficulty encountered in getting large orders filled. The machinery in the quarry and the number of men employed at the present time are not sufficient to turn out large orders within the short time generally allowed by the contractors. A company has been incorporated with capital stock of \$150,000, and an option on the Blair property has been procured. It is proposed to buy the quarry for \$70,000, to install modern machinery and to employ a number of men in quarrying the granite. With the needed improvements Pacific coast dealers will buy the Ashland granite in preference to any other, according to Mr. Carter. All of the dealers who have handled the Ashland granite pronounce it equal to the granite mined in Vermont and some of them declare it is superior. Mr. Carter stated that he would back the above statement with more than 20 letters from Pacific coast dealers and from dealers in the east.

orchards were sprayed a week or ten days ago the second application should be applied not to exceed two weeks between applications. Many growers had serious infestation last year and if they wish to prevent a repetition, they will do well to keep their fruit absolutely covered while the first brood is working. This first brood will strike along for over a month and it will not be possible to control it with one spraying. It is also of vital importance at this time of the year to coat the under side of all the leaves thoroughly, as a large percentage of the eggs are laid on the under side of the leaves. In orchards where the trees are large, and spray guns have not proved satisfactory it will be well to use rods with an angle nozzle of about 45 degrees. If these angle nozzles are properly used, the under and upper side of the leaves may be coated thoroughly. Too much importance cannot be placed on this first brood. If some worms are allowed to get by at this time, it is almost impossible to control them in the second brood. Some of the pear growers who did not put on the early arsenate spray are now having trouble with little green worms known as sawfly larvae. Such trees should be sprayed before the worms go into the crotch stage in order to prevent serious infection next year. These worms are easily killed with arsenate and if not destroyed at this time will be a menace next year. Caslen sprayer is recommended at the rate of 1 1/2 pounds to 200 gallons of water. Standard strength arsenate of lead, which is 1 pound dry or 2 pounds of paste to 50 gallons of water is sufficient, but unless the spraying is thoroughly done, it will not be possible to control the worms.
