MEMORIAL DAY PROGRAM, MAY 30 ANNOUNCED

Among the features of the Memorial Day program to be held at the Page theatre at 10:15 A. M., Tuesday, May 30, will be an address delivered by Rev. Charles A. Edwards of Ashland and an address for the unknown dead by Rev. V. H. Leach of this city.

The parade will form in the following order at the park and will move at 10:00 a. m.

Marchal, William Offutt, G. A. R. Pipe and Drum Corps, G. A. R. W. R. C. band, Co. A, American Legion, Ladies' Auxiliary, civic organizations, speakers in autos, mayor and city council, school children, citizens.

Line of march will be to the Bear creek bridge where flowers will be strewn on the waters in memory of the sailors and marines who gave their lives in defense of their country. A salute for the dead will be fired by a squad from Company A, and the parade will then proceed to the theatre.
