DEMENTED MAN
STAGES THRILLER
IN MOVIE FASHION

OMAHA, Neb., May 28.—Sheriff's deputies today were searching for an unidentified man, believed demented who Saturday lured Katherine McManman, 21 and Mrs. Roy Jenkins, 29, both of Omaha, into an automobile, according to their story and drove them to a half completed shack where he bound them together with a heavy log chain from which they were not liberated until today, when an expert locksmith was called to untie them. He told them, they said, he intended holding them for ransom.

Attracted yesterday by distress signals from the women, H. E. Boyd, a passing motorist, was forced by the unidentified man who was armed with two pistols, to go into the shack, where he told, he said, was held prisoner until late last night when he worked himself free and notified the sheriff's office. Boyd reported that his captor said he intended to "get rid of him and started to dig a grave which deputies said they found at daylight this morning.

Boyd escaped when his captor disappeared. Deputies kept the victims at the shack all night so they could identify the hunted man if he reappeared.
