Hill was one of the election officials in the Oakdale precinct. In the East Medford precinct, a tie vote resulted between J. F. Hittson and Dr. J. F. Reddy, with five votes apiece. The law provides that in such cases, the tied contestants appear before the county clerk and draw lots to decide the winner.

In the Eagle Point precinct five contestants were tied with one vote each, and the same rule applies there.
