DEMOCRATIC PROBE DEPT. OF JUSTICE KILLED IN HOUSE

WASHINGTON, June 1.—(By the Associated Press.)—A new broadside from the democrats with the administration in general and the department of justice in particular as targets followed action by the house rules committee on the resolution seeking investigation of the alleged laxity of the government in the prosecution of war fraud cases.

The committee by a vote of 7 to 1, rescinded its action giving privileged status to the Woodruff-Johnson resolution for investigation of the prosecution, and the storm broke thereon.

Representative Gamett, the democratic leader and a member of the committee, declared that according to his information Attorney General Daugherty had induced Chairman Campbell to enhance his vote to prevent investigation of the department of justice.

Chairman Campbell and Representative Schall, republican of Minnesota, who voted originally to report the resolution, reversed themselves and supported a republican motion to rescind. Representative Pou, North Carolina, ranking democrat of the committee, made a point of order against the motion, but Chairman Campbell overruled it.

Mr. Pou and Representative Garrett, Tennessee and Riordan of New York, democrats; and Johnson, republican of South Dakota, joint author with Representative Woodruff, republican of Michigan, of the resolution calling for investigation, voted against any change of front.

The committee action means that the resolution will never reach the house and ends all agitation so far as the house is concerned for a congressional inquiry as the resolution cannot be taken up without a special rule.

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dard Oil of New Jersey and California were offset by gains of 1 to 2½ points in Royal Dutch, Mexican Petroleum, Maryland, Houston, Cosden and Shell Transport, independent steels were heavy as were also some of the equipments, tobaccos and food specialties.
