

TAKAHASHI, HEAD JAPANESE CABINET QUITS HIS POST

TOKIO, June 6.—(By Associated Press.) The regent to the throne summoned today the elder statesmen for a consultation on the subject of a successor to Premier Takahashi, who with his cabinet resigned early this morning.

Premier Takahashi did not recommend his successor. Word was received that Marquis Saionji, former premier and an elder statesman, was ill and would be unable to attend the conclave.

The statement was given out that the cabinet's resignation was not based on political issues, much less on the ministry policy, but was due entirely to a divergence on the question of the reconstruction of the cabinet itself.

Tokugoro Nakahashi, minister of education and Hajime Motoda, minister of communications, have been expelled from the Sei Yukai, the government party, which holds them responsible for the downfall of the cabinet. The two ministers refused to resign when requested to by the premier who had been empowered by the Sei Yukai to re-organize the cabinet as he saw fit.

TEST INVENTION TELEPHONE SERVICE

QUITS CONGRESS TO BE A PROSECUTOR

LINCOLN, Neb., June 5.—Governor Samuel V. McKelvie announced today he had received the resignation of Congressman C. F. Reavis, effective yesterday. A special election to name a successor may be necessary. Congressman Reavis resigned as representative in order that he might accept a commission from Attorney General Daugherty as a special prosecutor in the war frauds case now pending.

Troopers Killed.

BALTIMORE, Md., June 6.—Two soldiers were killed, two suffered probably fatal injuries and six others were hurt when a truck carrying ten troopers from Camp Holabird went over an embankment near Westminster, Md., today. The dead are privates Parent and Herschner.

COLUMBIA RIVER RISES SWIFTLY

PORTLAND, Ore., June 5.—The Columbia and lower Willamette rivers showed further rise today as a result of melting snow in the Columbia water shed.

The Willamette reached 19.5 feet here today. Lower docks were submerged. The Columbia showed a rise of 1.5 feet since Saturday morning, according to a report from Vancouver, Wash.

Fimsy Structures Topple

LEMBERG, Poland, June 6.—(By Associated Press.) More than forty persons were buried in the debris and many were killed today when two ancient three-story buildings collapsed. The buildings are believed to have been shaken down by vibrations caused from a passing motor truck.

ESPEE NET INCOME DECREASE, WHILE EXPENSE GAINS

NEW YORK, June 6.—New railway operating income of the Southern Pacific and its subsidiaries for 1921, of \$35,946,946 shows a gain over the previous year of \$14,634,347, or 68.67 per cent according to the detailed annual report released today.

Total railway operating revenues of \$269,494,365 increased \$12,775,139 or 4.53 per cent and net revenues from railway operations of \$56,922,163 increased \$16,766,388 or 41.75 per cent.

Net income after the usual gross deductions aggregated \$30,618,778, a net decrease of \$1,451,497, representing a loss of 4.53 per cent from returns of 1920.

Total railway operating expenses of \$212,572,263 were less by \$29,541,527, a saving of 12.20 per cent.

Total current assets of \$85,706,599 decreased \$4,275,292 and total assets of \$1,950,393,052, decreased \$17,161,653. Among the liabilities are "unadjusted credits" of \$189,624,794, an increase of \$37,595,394.

'FORD FOR PRESIDENT' CLUB GAINS GROUND

DETROIT, Mich., June 6.—Permanent organization of the "Ford for President club" and the naming of a committee formally to ask Henry Ford to become an independent candidate for the presidency is planned by the manufacturer's townspeople, who have called a meeting at Dearborn tonight.

Mr. Ford has not publicly announced his attitude but a number of his friends at Dearborn declare he has indicated he would enter the race should the public desire him to do so.

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EPIDEMIC DEATHS FROM DROWNING

SEATTLE, June 6.—The Cle Elum river claimed its fifth victim within three days yesterday when Mathilda Leneck, two year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Leneck of Roslyn rolled down a bank into the river and was drowned.

The bodies of four men, drowned last Friday when they attempted to cross the river at the Cle Elum pipe line crossing, have not been recovered.

INVITE FULL PROBE OF STEEL MERGER

NEW YORK, June 6.—Eugene M. Grace, president of the Bethlehem Steel corporation today issued a statement declaring he would "welcome the fullest investigation" by the federal trade commission at Washington of the proposed merger of Bethlehem with the Lackawanna Steel company.

"We believe that when the facts in the case are full shown, the purchase would be approved," he said.
