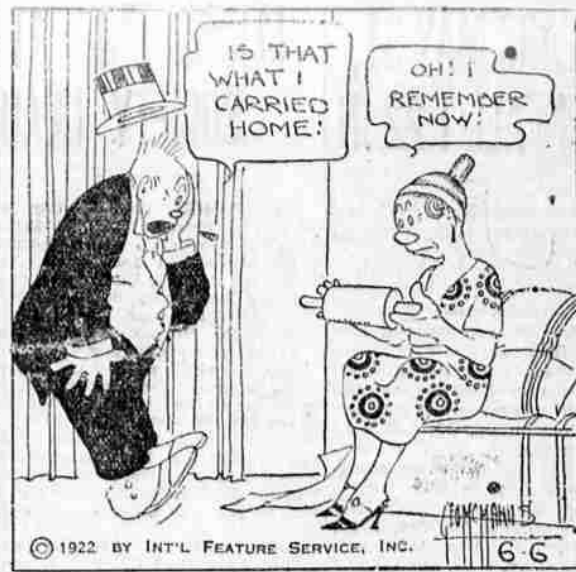

ENLARGE SCOPE OF BANKER'S SHARE ON GERMAN LOAN

PARIS, June 6.—(By Associated Press.) The desirability of enlarging the scope of the international bankers' committee which has been considering a foreign loan for Germany was unofficially discussed today by the members of the reparations commission. They decided to meet tomorrow to formulate a reply to the bankers, who recently asked for information as to the credit basis proposed.

It was said this afternoon it was possible the answer would be formulated and transmitted officially by the commission, instead of informally, as at first intended.

The French member of the reparations commission is known to have been instructed by Premier Poincaré not to approve any reduction in the total amount of reparations charged against Germany, but it is considered quite possible that the commission without committing itself to any such reduction may offer any suggestions they think might be helpful in solving the problem of an international loan.

NEW YORK, June 6.—Free offerings in industrial shares continued, the efforts to prevent the merger of some of the independent steel companies inviting realization and bear selling. Abundant supplies of money at lower rates and a rise in demand sterling at 4.51 were without sustaining effect. Mexican, California and Pan-American Petroleum, American Smelter Tobacco, Studebaker and Kennecott Copper were depressed, 2 to 2½ points. A few shares pursued a contrary course, Consolidated Gas rising 2½, New York, Chicago and St. Louis first preferred 2, and United States Alloy Steel Common and Great Northern 1 to 1½.
