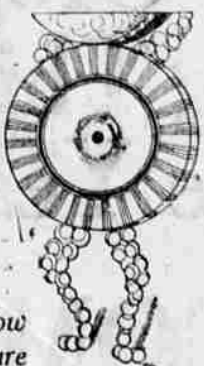

Though the love of god shoots, he doesn't want to know the patronymic of his target. He fires away and the rest of us are interested because if we weren't there soon would be no more targets to fire at, and the world would soon be like the moon—beautiful to look at but of no interest to real estate dealers.

So, when the victim is up for sentence, the death squad aims. Cupid unlimbers his bow and the result is—death or matrimony as the case may be, but "vital statistics" in any event.

Yet we do not count the victim a fool when he's hit and if he likes it, we do not say that he lives in a fool's paradise. When the victim of the firing squad drops, we do not say he is a fool, either. We merely sympathize with or envy him. Thus, too, we ought to give the dropped victim of Cupid's bow the benefit of our commiseration as well as gifts to his bride.

In the choice of titles for motion pictures, selection frequently falls on those that fit the subject with the ac-

curacy of a halo but without the glory. Such is the title of "Fool's Paradise" which gives but little suggestion of the dramatic and scenic qualities that are revealed in Cecil B. DeMille's production coming to the Rialto theatre today matinee for a four days showing.

The paradise that Arthur Phelps inherits, in his blindness, is not a fool's. It is the paradise of a good man hoaxed through a weakness that did not involve his intelligence, but his senses. He couldn't see the woman he married. He thought she was the woman he loved. Thus, in his blindness he is fooled, but no fool, for he unwittingly gathers to his bosom all that makes life worth living—whether the abiding place is that of fools or wise men.

Tendler Knocks Barrett Out.
PHILADELPHIA, June 7.—Lew Tendler of Philadelphia today was more firmly established as formal contender for the crown of Benny Leonard, lightweight boxing champion, as a result of the knockout he scored last night over Bobby Barrett of Clifton Heights, Pa.

The final blow came at the end of the sixth round, the referee having counted only nine when the bell ended the round. Five minutes elapsed before Barrett was able to be assisted from the ring. Some maintain that the blow was low, despite the referee's decision otherwise. Barrett's father and a number of other rooters jumped into the ring. Twenty policemen rushed in and prevented trouble. A physician who examined Barrett in the ring declared no foul blow had been struck.

"Babe" Ruth had a tough time in the first game of the Yankees' invasion of the west. "Red" Faber of Chicago struck him out twice. Another time he tapped easily to Collins and was tossed out at first. On his other chance he gave the fans a thrill as he shot a hot liner toward the right field bleachers but Strunk went back against the fence and pulled it down.

Waite Hoyt's clever hurling, Bob Meusel's fourth home run of the season and a trio of sensational catches in center field by Whitey Witt combined to give the Yanks a 3 to 1 victory over the White Sox.

The Detroit Tigers were on a batting spree at the expense of Hasty and Yarrison, easily defeating Philadelphia 14 to 1 behind Pillette's good pitching. Hellmann and Veach contributed homers.
