ASHLAND'S JULY 4TH CELEBRATION IS FORUM TOPIC

A large delegation of Ashland business men attended the Chamber of Commerce forum luncheon at the Hotel Medford this noon for the purpose of inviting the citizens of Medford to attend the Fourth of July celebration to be held in Ashland this year and to assist and cooperate with the city of Ashland in making it the most successful ever.

Chairman C. C. Lemmon of the local chamber, called upon Rev. Edwards as the first speaker from Ashland. He made a short address telling something of the plans for the celebration and requesting Medford's cooperation at the same time, pledging Ashland's support in any project beneficial to southern Oregon. He pointed out that the Ashland attendance exceeded the Medford attendance this noon and that while in Medford the Ashlanders were Medfordites.

B. V. Carter spoke following Mr. Edwards and extended a cordial invitation to attend the celebration. He also put in a boost for the county fair and said that he felt confident that Ashland would give the fair her wholehearted support. Mr. Carter stated that he believed that ultimately the Jackson County Fair would equal the State Fair at Salem, and possibly eclipse it.

A. C. Ninger was the next speaker on the program. He gave the audience a definite outline of the celebration program, which will start Saturday, July 1, and which will not terminate until Tuesday night. One of the largest open air dance pavilions is to be opened on the first day of the four day celebration, and the management states that a real orchestra will be employed. In Lithia park on Sunday afternoon a band concert will be given. Monday will be Ford day and a Ford parade will take place. This promises to be a unique sight as prizes will be awarded to the Ford coming the longest distance to participate, the Ford with the five shortest people, the Ford carrying the largest number of passengers, the Ford with the largest number of children. A brand new Ford will be given away Monday.

On the 4th there will be ball games between Leland and Grants Pass and Ashland will probably challenge the winner. Arrangements are being made for a wrestling match for the 2nd or 4th between Hand and Miller, for the world's middleweight championship.

Following the speech by Mr. Ninger, Secretary Fuller of the Ashland Chamber of Commerce made a few brief remarks and urged Medford people to take part in the big Jackson county parade. The parade is to be one of the features of the celebration and every motorist in Jackson county should participate to make the thing a success. In the evening on the 4th, there will be the usual display of fireworks.

Mrs. Onrue, state chairman of the W. C. T. U., spoke on behalf of the Farm Home to be built near Corvallis for the dependent children of Oregon. The home is to be "A real home on a real farm," where orphan children are to be cared for. It will consist of a series of cottages and is not to be an "institution," but a real home, according to Mrs. Onrue. It devolves upon the people of the state to create such a home, stated the speaker, in order to prevent the dependent children in the state from becoming delinquents and criminals and to make them self supporting instead of a burden to the state.
