

PRINCE REGENT OF JAPAN INTERESTED IN GOLF GAME

HAKONE, Japan.—Many departures from the usual activities of the imperial family are being made by the prince regent, but none more noticeable than his interest in sport. During his visit to Europe he was attracted by golf, and on his return here started taking lessons from members of the different clubs which are increasing in Japan. He put in some practice for his game with the Prince of Wales and while it was noticed that he had a good style, his efficiency in the game was not marked, due largely to nervousness caused by the clicking of camera as he came to the tee to drive off. After his match with the English prince the prince regent came to Hakone and practiced daily on the links of the hotel, which was also contrary to precedent. Another surprise for the Japanese people was that the prince regent in going to and returning from the course instead of saluting formally, took off his golf cap and nodded in the most informal manner.

WOMEN BETTER SOUND BOARDS THAN MERE MAN

CHICAGO.—Women's voices have a direct effect on auditorium acoustics, according to Prof. F. R. Watson of the department of physics of the University of Illinois. "Speakers can be heard more easily when their audience is composed chiefly of women than when it is preponderately masculine," he said. "This is because women, as experiments have shown, absorb more sound than men, owing to the clothing worn."

Prof. Watson, who analyzed the acoustic properties of the Municipal Pier here, and whose recommendations for improvements were adopted by the city authorities, has devised an instrument that simplifies acoustic analyses. It is an arc-light reflector, which sends its blinding light together with a beam of light to inaccessible ceiling surfaces to determine the presence and paths of any echoes. As the sounds and the light take the same path, the light indicates the point in the ceiling surface where the sound strikes, and the angle of sound reflection is then mathematically computed. A standard organ pipe is blown and the time taken for the sound to die out is measured with a stop-watch.

"The usual trouble in an auditorium," said Prof. Watson, "results from the fact that the walls do not absorb sound to any great extent, and consequently the word uttered by the speaker takes a long time to die out. In the meantime other words are spoken that become confused with the sound of the first words. In some cases curved walls produce echoes and concentrate the sound in unexpected ways. Sound-absorbing materials are the usual corrective; cushions in the seats are quite efficient, but in some cases hair felt should be placed on the walls."
