NEW YORK, June 20.—Highest prices for a year or more were established by speculative favorites during the morning. Mexican petroleum increased its gain to 9 1/2 points and Studebaker rose 3 1/2 points. Most other foreign and domestic oils continued to strengthen. Independent steel were substantially better. Gulf States rising over 5 points. Gains of 1 to 2 points were scored by Crucible, Lackawanna, Midvale, Vanadium, Nova Scotia and Republic. American and Baldwin locomotives were strongest of the equipments. Corn products, coca cola, allied chemicals, American smelting and Sears Roebuck gained 1 to 2 points. Rails remained sluggish on very light dealings. Call money opened at 3 per cent and foreign exchanges were firmer.
