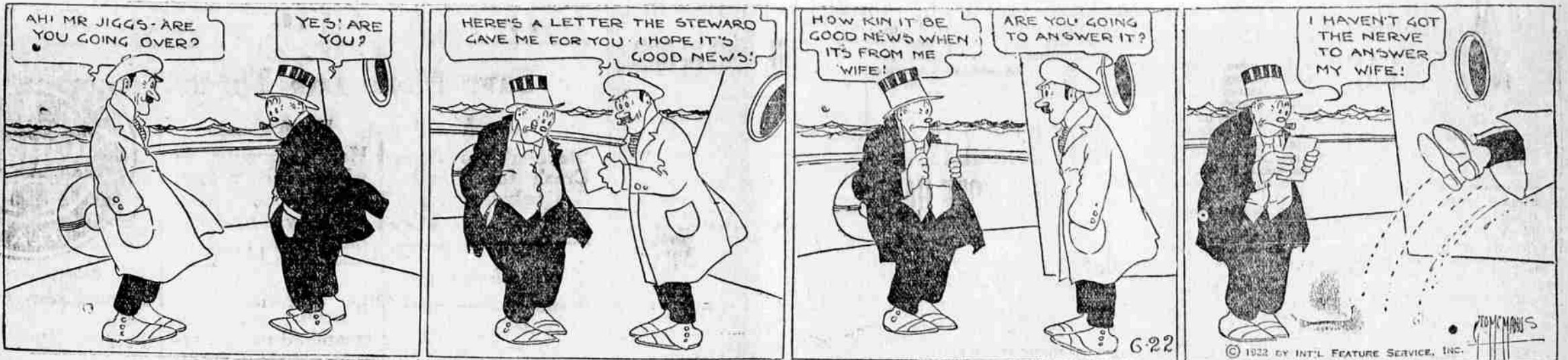


BRINGING UP FATHER

SENSATIONAL RISE
MEX. OIL PROBED

NEW YORK, June 22.—The committee on business conduct of the New York stock exchange late today began an investigation of the recent sensational movements of Mexican petroleum stock on the floor of the exchange, according to an announcement carried today by the Dow Jones financial ticker.

The investigation follows rumors of various sorts which began to be heard about the financial district when the stock started on its unprecedented boom.

Letters were sent to all members of the exchange calling for a report of their positions on the stock.
