STANDARDS NAMED FOR EXHIBITS TO COUNTY FAIR, ETC.

"In judging the Josephine County household exhibits at their county fair last year, many women made this statement to me, 'We should have known before we exhibited what points were to be scored,' or 'I am sure I could have brought a better display if I had known what standards were required,' said Florence Pool, home demonstration agent.

"Household exhibits at the coming Jackson County fair should demonstrate standards of excellence in cookery, in sewing and other needlework and in handwork of various kinds," continued Miss Pool. "For this reason score cards for household exhibits at fairs have been prepared by Mrs. Jessie D. McComb, in charge of home economics extension of O. A. C., and will be available for anyone wishing copies, at the home demonstration office.

"There are some of the standards: 'Canned Fruits: Canned fruit should be uniform in size, shape and degree of ripeness, carefully prepared, evenly packed and not overcooked. It should be clean and of natural color. Syrup should be clean and not too heavy, free from sediment and not too abundant.

"Canned Vegetables: Canned vegetables should be uniform in size, medium mature, neatly packed, have a natural flavor and color, small proportions of liquid, and be firm but well cooked.

"Jelly: Jelly should be clear, sparkling, and with no sign of crystals, retain its shape after removal from glass should be the natural color and have the flavor of the fruit. It should be tender, should cut easily with a spoon, and yet be so firm that the angles of the cut edges remain. No foreign substance should appear in jelly. The container should be clean, with a closely fitted lid and a neat label."

NOTED PAINTER OF LANDSCAPES HAS LOCAL EXHIBITS

Dr. O. Boto Schellberg, eminent New York physician and specialist on intestinal infections, whose hobby is the painting of landscapes, left this city last night for Salem where he will visit his brother.

Dr. Schellberg has been at Crater Lake and Prospect for the past two weeks and returned Thursday evening with three small canvases which are not yet complete. These canvases were on exhibition in the Warner, Wortman and Gore window yesterday and are views of Union Peak, Rogue River Gorge and Castle Creek canyon, three points of beauty and interest in the Crater Lake district.

Dr. Schellberg is an Oregonian, having left this state 27 years ago for New York City, where he now maintains a large hospital for the treatment of persons afflicted with intestinal disorders. Since the institution of the hospital, according to the New York Medical Journal, Dr. Schellberg has treated more than 36,000 cases.

This was the doctor's first visit to Crater Lake and he was greatly impressed with the possibilities offered for the exercise of artistic ability at this famous beauty spot of the northwest. He had only small canvases with him and was without essential equipment and therefore did not attempt a picture of the lake, but states that he will return in the spring of next year. At this time he will be accompanied by Jerry Waltman, a prominent New York artist, and an especially able and vivid painter of snow scenes. All the necessary equipment will be taken to the lake and will be set up at the water's edge or on Wizard Island as the doctor is of the opinion that from either of these two points, a better study can be made than from a point on the rim.

The doctor is delighted with the treatment accorded him by the inhabitants of the district between Prospect and the Lake and complimented Jim Grieco and John Mahen highly on their congeniality and hospitality which he says is to be found in no other part of the country which he has ever visited.

CHINA'S NOTED DIPLOMAT AND LEADER, DEAD

SHANGHAI, June 23.—(By the Associated Press.)—Wu Ting Fang, former minister to Washington, more recently foreign minister for Sun Yat Sen in the disrupted southern republican government, at Canton, died at Canton this morning, according to a Reuter dispatch.

Wu, an outstanding leader in the politics jurisprudence of China for many years, remained at last reports, loyal to Sun Yat Sen and was believed to have fled Canton with the deposed South China president. The Reuter dispatch gave no details.

In 1917 Wu Ting Fang was prime minister of the Peking republican government. After the government, as then constituted was overthrown by Militarists, he went to Shanghai. Later he was his lot with Sun Yat Sen and since had been Sun's most powerful statesman.

When Li Yuan-Hung recently was restored to the presidency of the Central government in Peking, he telegraphed Wu an offer to be premier at Peking. So far as the correspondent had been able to learn, the offer was ignored.

Northern statesmen had expressed the opinion that Wu could do more perhaps than any other man to bring the north and south together.

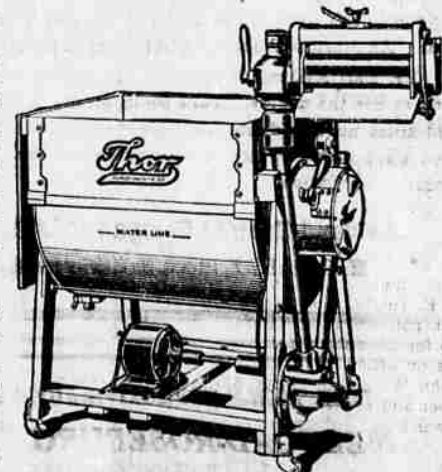
