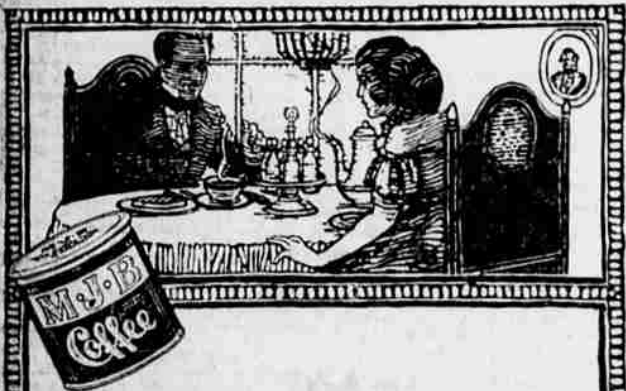


FIRST BABY CLINIC AT RIVERSIDE IS LARGELY ATTENDED

CLARKSBURG, W. Va., June 23.—Two men were killed, a deputy sheriff suffered a broken arm and a dozen other persons received minor injuries when a mob attacked an interurban traction car carrying non-union miners and officers of the Hudson Coal company, guarded by deputy sheriffs, from this city to Lewis Mine near Reynoldsville this morning.

The mob stopped the car, pulled off the trolley and swarmed aboard. Two of the attacking party were shot as they crawled through windows. The mine was operated on an open shop basis Monday.
