

REPORT TOURISTS AT ASHLAND AUTO CAMP APPROVE PAY SYSTEM

J. H. Doran, the caretaker of the Ashland automobile camp grounds says that he finds the sentiment very strong among the tourists in favor of the standardized pay camp over the free ones and that the number who object to pay is exceedingly small against those who show a preference to the charge being made.

Ashland has a standardized camp with the privilege of a ten day stay. The first two days a charge of 50c per day is made, and additional days at the rate of 25c per day. Since May 22, the day upon which they began to charge, 925 cars were registered up to last night. One-third of the cars stay the second day and longer, so that the approximate receipts for the past two months in round figures are \$616.

Wm. Davis, the caretaker of the Medford automobile camp grounds reports that he has registered 528 cars since March 20, and that approximately one out of every six cars stay the second day and longer. If Medford would have been in position to offer the tourists a standardized service this season, the income up to this time would have been approximately \$315.

Because the Medford camp lacks the conveniences of a standardized camp, the tourists are not attracted here, nor are they anxious to stop any longer than necessary. Valuable data is being secured this year in both Ashland and Medford camps which will undoubtedly influence the citizens of Medford in making their camp a source of income instead of an expense to the taxpayers.

LOGGING CAMP BANDITS FACING LIFE SENTENCES

PORT ANGELES, Wash., June 23.—C. H. Riley and Charles Butt were found guilty of murder in the first degree for the shooting of Ray Light, during a holdup of the Discovery Bay Logging company March 25. The jury, reporting at 1:20 this morning, after deliberating 7 hours, recommending life imprisonment. Light, a former service man, was playing cards with other employees of the lumber camp when two highwaymen accosted them. The fatal shooting of Light followed.

HEAT AND DROUGHT LIFT WHEAT PRICES

CHICAGO, June 23.—Heat and drought pointing toward likelihood of shrinkage in the crop yield tended to lift wheat prices today in the first part of the board of trade session. Besides, Liverpool quotations showed a greater upturn than had been looked for, and Argentine dispatches told of increased export business. On the advance here, however, selling became enlarged and the market reacted somewhat. Opening prices, which ranged from 5-8 to 1-4 higher, July \$1.14 1/2 to \$1.15, and September \$1.15 1/2 to \$1.16, were followed by a slight setback.

Corn and oats were firmer with wheat. After opening 1-8 to 5-8 cents higher, July 63 5-8 to 63 3-4, the corn market sagged a little.

Oats started quarter to 7-8c higher, July 36 3-4 to 37 1-8c and held at about the opening range.

Low quotations on hogs weakened provisions.

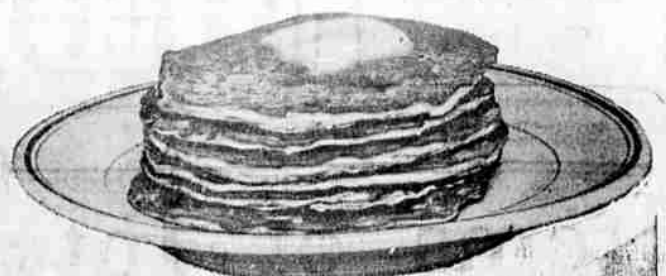
