

TAX REDUCTION MEASURES FAIL TO GET SIGNERS

SALEM, Ore., July 7.—J. C. Cooper, of McMinnville, president of the state tax reduction clubs resigned his office during the first session of the state convention of the tax clubs here yesterday.

Mr. Cooper said that he was growing too old to properly handle the duties of the office.

W. H. Stevens of Gervais, was named temporary chairman of the convention.

The morning session was enlivened by the action of the credentials committee in seating all delegates favorable to the platform adopted at the state meeting held in Portland.

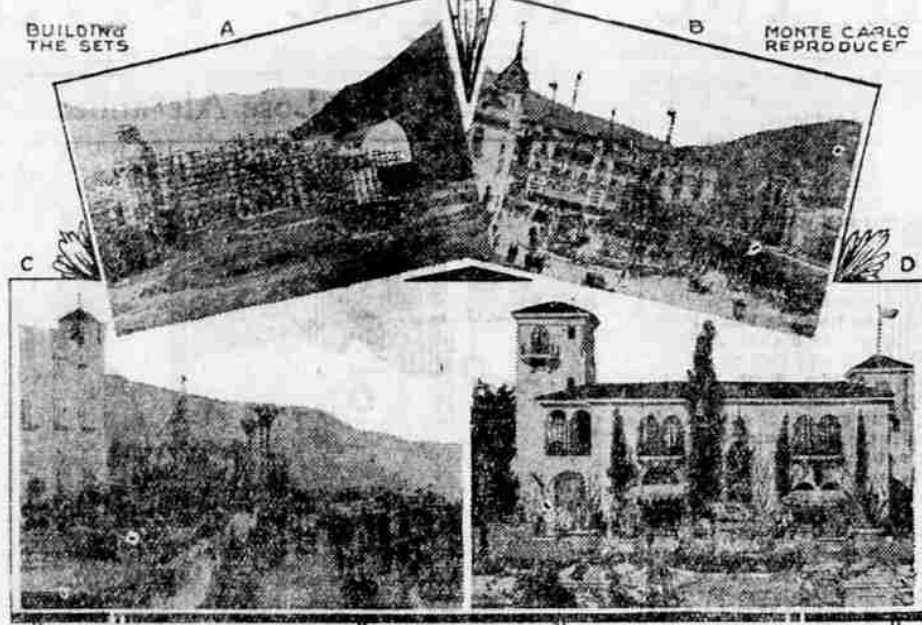
Dr. A. Slaughter, chairman of the committee on proposed legislation, reported that the measures initiated by the tax clubs and the state grange, including the income tax measure, the tax equalization measure and the measures calling for the repeal of the millage bills for the University of Oregon and Oregon Agricultural college, lacked thousands of signatures of having enough to place them before the people at the general election in November, and would not be ready for filing before the closing of the statutory time limit tonight.

MONTE CARLO REPRODUCED IN "FOOLISH WIVES"

Half a Million Spent in Duplicating Famous Buildings



The first real million-dollar photodrama has made its appearance. It is "Foolish Wives," an extravagant picture of life and adventures at Monte Carlo. In the lavishness of its sets, the absolute accuracy of its details and its unusual characterizations, it is reputed to outstrip anything hitherto attempted for the screen. It is to be presented at the Page theatre today, Saturday, Sunday and Monday.

More than \$100,000 alone was spent for sets and that varying numbers of "extra" actors, from several hundreds to several thousands, were used from time to time to get crowd scenes typical of the surging pleasure-seekers who throng the piazzas, the parks, the promenades and cafes of Monte Carlo. The director himself plays the role of the Continental Lotherio and is said to have created a character recognized as the most debonair, yet the most despicable ever seen on the screen.

A strong cast appears with von Stroheim, Maude George and Mae Busch, two adventuresses, accomplices of the "Count." Miss du Pont takes the role of the frivolous American wife, while

Rudolph Christians plays her husband. Dale Fuller appears as a servant maid. Cesare Gravina appears as an old Italian counterfeiter, and Malveon Polo, as his halfwit daughter.

The characters delineated by these and other members of the cast are said to be gems of histrionic art. Von Stroheim, who directed "Blind Husbands" and "The Devil's Pass Key," long has been noted for the vividness of his characters. In "Foolish Wives," he has gone much further, it is understood in creating characters.

It took more than eighteen months to produce "Foolish Wives." Actual figures for the production show that 320,000 feet of film were taken. This has been cut down to a little over 10,000 feet.

It is of interest to note that scores of prominent San Francisco society folk acted as "extras." They were used to give tone to the promenade scenes showing the Monte Carlo ocean terraces, where Europe and America's aristocracy are to be found strolling during the Riviera season.

INSTRUCTIONS ARE ISSUED TO FIGHT NEW CODLING MOTH

The second brood of codling moth are beginning to emerge. This brood will string along for several weeks. Apples should be sprayed between the 10th and 15th of July, following with another application in two or three weeks. In old blocks of Bartlett pears where worms have been bad, these pears should be sprayed between the 10th and 15th and again about August 1st. The pear orchards where worms have not been so bad, and where one application will control, this should be made from July 17th to 22nd. This application will probably be all that is necessary in Bartlett pears in most of the orchard districts.

A Casell spreader of a pound to 200 gallon tank may be beneficial at this time. There is going to be a lot of damage from codling moth and the application of the second brood should be very thoroughly applied.

Use from four to six pounds of dry arsenate of lead, and eight to twelve pounds of paste, to two gallon tank. By measuring the required amount of lead out in different pails and soaking in water over night, will increase the efficiency for spreading qualities very materially.

Examine lands that are on the trees every four or five days and kill all of the worms that you find under the bands. This is very important and will give results.

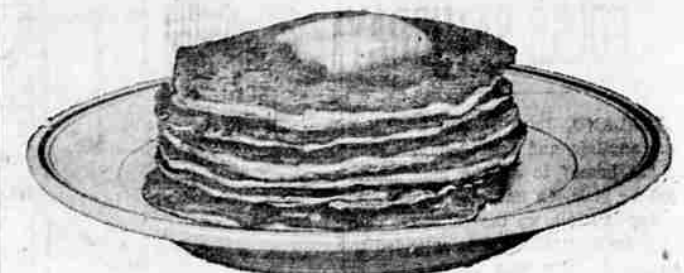

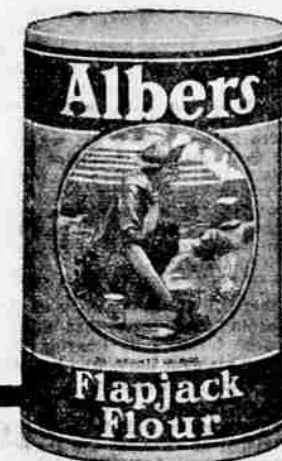
