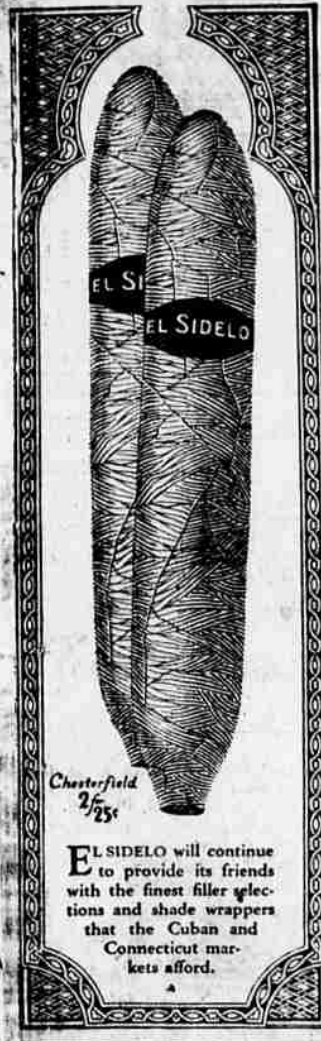


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HIGH OFFICIAL TO ADDRESS FORUM MEETING FRIDAY

Only upon rare occasions do the citizens of Medford get the opportunity to hear high governmental officials and when such an opportunity occurs, the business men should make every effort to hear what these officials have to offer.

At the forum of the Medford Chamber of Commerce tomorrow noon, Gordon Lee, chief of the automotive division of the United States Department of Commerce will address the members on "How the Business Man Can Make His Taxes Pay Him a Profit."

L. E. Warford, formerly on the staff of several Portland papers and who is an Oregonian through and through, is now in the automotive division at Washington, D. C. He arranged the trip of Gordon Lee through Oregon and it was he who gave Medford the honor of a visit by the chief of his department.

Because of the limited time which Mr. Lee has in Oregon, the automobile dealers of Roseburg, Grants Pass, Klamath Falls and Ashland as well as members of the Chambers of Commerce of these places have been invited the privilege of the forum which will take place at the Medford Hotel tomorrow noon.

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FORD AND FORDSON POWER EXPOSITION 'DOPE' AND DATA

Remarkable time is being made by the Ford and Fordson power exposition on the long trip from Portland to Ashland prior to a two day's demonstration in Medford Monday and Tuesday, July 17 and 18.

Leaving Roseburg Wednesday morning at 7 o'clock, the caravan covered two long, steep and winding detours, one from Myrtle Creek to Canyonville and the other around Smith Hill, reaching Grants Pass at 8 o'clock last night. Some difficulty was experienced in making a few of the extremely sharp turns, but at no time was the caravan stalled for lack of power.

An especially interesting feature of this show is the Lincoln chassis. At all points along the line great crowds have turned out to see the big car, and after participating in a local parade, the Lincoln will be available for further inspection upon the premises of the C. E. Gates Auto Co.

A complete list of the equipment included in the caravan is as follows: Plows, mower, spray pump, disc, cultipacker, harrows, Fresno scraper, berry cultivator, contractors' dump bodies, road graders, tractor hoist, brush breaker, side hill hitch, release clevis, binder hitch, sub-oiler, the Wehr brake, five-ton four-wheel trailer, 2 1/2 ton trailer with pneumatic tires, light express body with curtains on truck, light delivery, panel body truck, open express and truck stake bodies. In addition, the caravan carries its own broadcasting and receiving set, a motion picture machine, a Delco lighting plant and other special features of an educational, instructive and entertaining nature.

Demonstrations will be made at a number of points instead of assembling and holding the entire equipment at any single place. Caravan headquarters, however, will be established at the Natatorium camp grounds, from which point the C. E. Gates Auto company will provide free transportation from the camp grounds to the scene of each and every demonstration in which any person may be interested.

Persons wishing to see a demonstration of any single piece of equipment should communicate with the C. E. Gates Auto Co. in ample time to complete arrangements for an adequate demonstration. There will be no charge of any kind for special demonstrations, but the two days' schedule will be somewhat crowded.

owing to requests already received. A detailed announcement of demonstrations already provided for, together with the location of each demonstration, will be announced in tomorrow's Mail-Tribune.

The caravan comprises 26 units operating under their own power, exclusive of additional units mounted on or drawn by trucks or tractors. About 40 men are with the show, and so keen has been the interest aroused en route south that elaborate preparations have been made for the caravan's reception on the return tour at which time from one to three days will be spent at each stopping place. The fact of the caravan having held so closely to its scheduled time gives assurance that all dates will be filled on time, it having been conclusively demonstrated that no detour or stretch of road between here and Portland is too difficult for the caravan.

Big Timber Deal.
WASHINGTON, July 13.—Sale of 235,000,000 board feet of timber along the upper Sauk river in the Snoqualmie national forest, Washington, was announced today by the forest service. The prices fixed in the contract, subject to readjustment at three-year intervals, were \$2.75 per 1000 board feet for cedar, \$2 for Douglas fir and fifty cents for white fir and hemlock.

SPIRITUALISM PUT ON GRILL, SATAN'S OWN WORK, CLAIM

Medford ministers should fear spiritualistic inroads. Satan is responsible for doctrine that lead communicate with living, asserts T. L. Thumler, at the tent last night in his lecture, "Spiritualism."

"The idea of spiritualism expressed in a few words is the belief that after people die there is a conscious entity commonly called the soul, possessing intelligence and abiding in a higher sphere, which through certain spiritualistic and material agencies can communicate with the living. It is not to be denied that some very remarkable revelations have been made through spiritualistic agencies. While some are frauds and humbugs it is nevertheless true that there is more to spiritualism than is commonly given to its credit because of the ignorance on the part of the people as to its true character."

It is easy enough for those who have never looked into it from the standpoint of either experience or study to scoff at it. Ridicule neither proves your intelligence nor gets rid of the very remarkable things produced thru its agency. It presents an array of testimony that will cause the most sober-minded to stop and consider; its power of deception lies in its ability to produce facts that are undeniable. When men of the type of Professor Hyslop of Columbia, Sir Oliver Lodge, and William T. Stead who after years of study, into psychical manifestations, declare their positive belief in spiritualism, the effect is but natural that the cult would gain many adherents, and it is bound to be the greatest deception of modern times.

"Spiritualism denies the inspiration and authority of the bible and the necessity for the atonement; it proclaims the divinity of man while denying the divinity of Christ. It exalts bitter opponents of Christianity to positions of honor in the spirit realm, but the very essence of its teaching consists of a certain spiritualization—and by that the dissipation—of those conceptions of truth and duty which an individual derives from reason and revelation, and upon which rest the stability of the home and of the state. Thus it leads the mind into mental and moral confusion and brings about a general weakening of the bonds of moral obligation, with a resulting antagonism to law both human and divine."

"When God separated ancient Israel from other peoples he gave them explicit instructions against the practice of witchcraft and sorcery and all consulting with 'familiar spirits.' These practices were common in the nations of that time with whom the Israelites had been in contact, and with the inhabitants of the country to which God was leading them."

A user of "divination," an "enchanter," a "witch," a "charmer," a "consultant with familiar spirits," a "wizard" and a "necromancer," are spoken of in the bible as "an abomination unto the Lord."

Sir Oliver Lodge, who is a prince among spiritualistic investigators, declares on the title page of the recent book, "Raymond, or life and death," that he gives "examples of the evidences of survival of memory and affection after death." A more startling contradiction of God's declaration "The memory of them is forgotten, also their love, and their hatred and their envy, is now perished; neither have they any more portion forever in anything that is done under the sun." Ecc. 9:5-6, it would be quite impossible to find. The subject of spiritualism resolves itself into a simple question of whom we will believe—God's word or man's word.

Pretending to bring to humanity light of a higher realm of knowledge, the results of spiritualism are visible in the sundering of marital ties and the wrecking of homes; the filling of insane asylums and of suicides graves. Its dangerous character is admitted by some of its eminent exponents, such as Arthur Conan Doyle and Hereward Carrington.

"The scriptures warn us that just prior to the coming of Christ, Satan will work in our world 'with all power and signs and lying wonders.' Unclean spirits will 'go forth unto the kings of the earth and of the whole world, to gather them to the battle of that great day of God Almighty.' Surely it was for such a time as this that these words of inspiration were given us."
