

IRISH NATIONALS CAPTURE VILLAGE IN COUNTY MAYO

DUBLIN, July 24.—(By the Associated Press.)—National army troops have gained a fresh victory in western Ireland, by capturing Ballyhaunis, county Mayo, from the republic (irregulars), it was announced today.

The free state triumph in the capture of Ballyhaunis was swiftly followed by successes in the surrounding districts. A number of minor positions in this area have been added to the list of free state victories according to today's official bulletin.

The total number of casualties in the Ballyhaunis fighting has not been accurately estimated, although it is known that at least 15 of the national troops were killed and 87 wounded. It is generally believed that at least 30 of the irregulars lost their lives. The total number of casualties suffered by free state forces during the capture of Ballyhaunis was nine killed and 19 wounded.

Unconfirmed reports today said the irregulars were retreating with all speed into the Galtee and Knockmealdown mountains, harassed by free state troops, who are pressing them hard and preventing their concentrating for resistance.

FOREST FIRES IN WASHINGTON STILL SERIOUS

OLYMPIA, Wash., July 24.—Two forest fire reports of a serious nature have been received from Grays Harbor country by State Forester Fred E. Pape. A blaze in the works of the Walker Brothers Lumber company, which has been under control for some time, suddenly broke away under a high wind and spread to the Humpulup Logging company works. An unofficial report said that the Humpulup company had lost its camp and a large number of logs. The fire has been partly checked, it is said.

The Wynochee Timber company, north of Montesano is reported to have lost heavily when a fire burned through four million feet of cut logs. The actual damage has not been estimated.

More than ten thousand acres have been burned over and one fire has enveloped almost 4,000 acres in northeastern Stevens county, according to John T. Rafis, secretary of the Stevens County Timber Protective association, who was here to confer with Mr. Pape today. The situation is the worst ever experienced in that part of the country. Mr. Rafis said, and efforts to check the flames have in most cases been rendered futile.

BENNY LEONARD CONFIDENT HE'LL DEFEAT TENDLER

PUDD LAKE, N. J., July 25.—This was the last full day that Champion Benny Leonard put in before his lightweight title bout with Lew Tandler of Philadelphia at Boyle's Thirty Acres, Jersey City, Thursday evening.

Before starting on his daily five mile run around the rim of the oval body of water from which this mosquito-bitten oasis of New Jersey derives its name Leonard made this bald statement: "I'll have no ally if I lose and I'll be disappointed if I don't win by a knockout before the seventh."

For two weeks Leonard has been surrounded by his family—mother, three brothers and a sister, who stay at a hotel not 100 yards from the training camp. Leonard says that today he is at the top of his career. He appears as finely pointed as a thoroughbred and as meticulously cared for as one—fed, rubbed and humored. He says this is the best year he ever will have. He feels so strong, lively and pugnacious that he has broken all championship records by boxing three top-notchers within four weeks.

The previous two fights—with Jack Britton, welterweight champion, and Rocky Kansas of Buffalo, have put him on the necessary edge for Tandler, who for more than a year has been the logical contender. Feeling so positive of himself, Leonard has signed for a fourth bout with Ever Hammer, a lad who has brought a two-fisted name for himself in the middleweight.

This bout probably will be held at Michigan City, Ind., August 5.

Leonard speaks slightly of Tandler's pugilistic ability. He holds Tandler cheaply, he says, because the Philadelphia record doesn't impress him. He avows that Tandler has been floored too often by men lacking a genuine punch and that Tandler doesn't tote the wallop that Leonard has demonstrated that he carries in both hands. He grants Tandler's aggressiveness and a certain amount of cleverness, but he withholds the label "championship caliber."

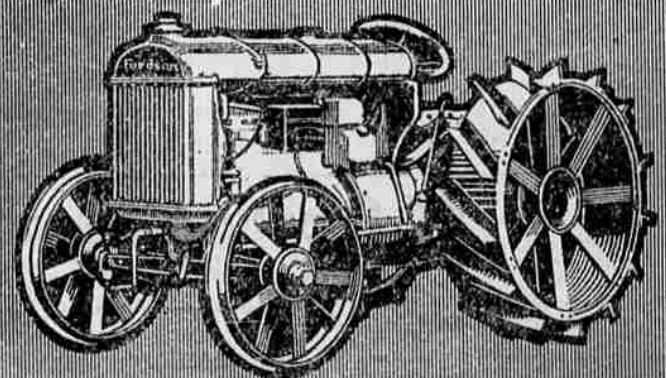

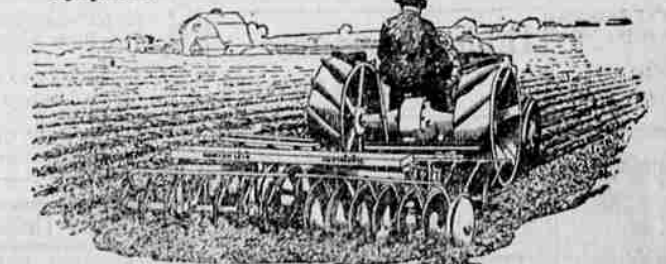
