# **VALUE FARM PRODUCTS** DECLINES 3 PER CENT

WASHINGTON. July 26.—The purchasing power or exchange value of farm products slumped four points between March and June to 72 per cent of the 1912 basis in the latter cent of the 1913 basis in the latter month, according to statistics made public today by the department of agriculture. The buying power of farm products in terms of other pro-ducts stood at 78 per cent in March, having advanced from 65 per cent in January, which was a rise of three points over the low mark touched in November, 1921.

Santa Fe and the Southern Pacific, reporting today to the United States railroad labor board in support of the roads' contention that the senior-ity question is the big issue at stake in the shop crafts strike, declared they had 16,020 men at work who would be affected by it.

These men, the roads said, have been promised that they will be pro-tected in their seniority rights over all men that may be employed later,

or who may return to their jobs.

The Santa Fe presented figures to the board showing 6,513 skilled me-chanics and 2598 shop laborers were at work in its shops last night.

The Southern Pacific report shows that out of 15,000 shopmen employed June 30, 5,268 did not walk out and that return of strikers and employment of new men have brought the total employed last night up to 6,-

Both roads told the labor board that the men now employed were all skilled mechanics or laborers qualistrikebreakers picked up at random

300 Trains Dropped.
WASHINGTON, July 26.— More than 300,000 miles of daily train service throughout the country has been discontinued since the railroad strike was declared, according to government officials, charged with keeping tab on the rail strike situation.

He cited numerous legal authorities in support of his

claims. The court then adjourned.

This afternoon arguments will be made by Attorney John J. Jeffreys, for the defendants in the action alleged to be Klansmen, and by Attorney O. C. Boggs, who is appearing for D.

M. Lowe, only.

For the plaintiff the law will be argued by Attorney Evans Reames and Gus Newbury.

It is expected that the arguments and oratory will take all day.


