N. Y. Stocks

NEW YORK, Aug. 5.—Prices strengthened substantially in today's first holiday session of the stock market, reflecting the financial community's optimism in a satisfactory solution of pending labor troubles. Several new highs for the week were recorded for rail and industrial shares in dealings that were obviously of a professional character. Rail stocks led the list in the second hour, conspicuous strength in this group being shown by Union Pacific, Canadian Pacific, Southern Railway common and preferred, Lehigh Valley, Chesapeake and Ohio, Perre Marquette, Rock Island, Colorado and Southern, and Missouri and Pacific common and preferred, which were up to 1 to 1 1/2 points. In the industrial list Kearsage stood out with a gain of 5 1/2 points, while Corn Products broke through to a new top for 1922. Lorillard and American Tobaccoes Wilson Packing, Detroit, Edinson and Wells Fargo also registered appreciable gains. Mullins Silk receded 2 1/2 points. The close was strong. Sales approximated 300,000 shares.
