CALIFORNIA FRUIT
MEN DEMAND END
ALL R. R. STRIKES

WENATCHEE, Wash., Aug. 17.—Unified action by all the leading fruit districts of the west is now reported by J. M. Wade, chairman of the growers and shippers' committee named Monday at the big meeting held here by men representing the major industries of four counties.

The committee which was for the purpose of taking action regarding the strike situation and which is acting as a clearing house for information is receiving voluminous telegrams and communications. Among those received today is the following message from Charles E. Virden, president of the California Fruit Distributors regarding the action of the San Francisco meeting:

"Today at a mass meeting of farmers of the state of California assembled in San Francisco, the following preamble and resolution were unanimously adopted:

"Whereas, farm production is the life blood of the nation; whereas transportation is absolutely necessary to existence of the people; whereas some permanent method must be at once found to make impossible now and forever the interruption of the nation's traffic; therefore be it resolved we demand immediate resumption of the railway service now interrupted; we urgently request that congress now in session enact legislation creating a board with absolute authority to prevent further interruption of transportation now and for all time; we demand pending immediate action of congress that all employees shall return to work and that the railroads shall give employment to such men. Would suggest that you give full publicity to this throughout Washington in any way you see fit."

The following telegram was received from the Florida citrus exchange which handles nearly all of the orange crop in that state:

"We will wire President Harding and wish to assure you of our support in the movement you have started. We will appreciate your keeping us informed as to progress. The nation must be fed. It should be made a crime to interfere with the transportation of food."

Meetings are being reported at Seattle, Portland, Los Angeles and Payette, Idaho, besides others which have been previously reported.
