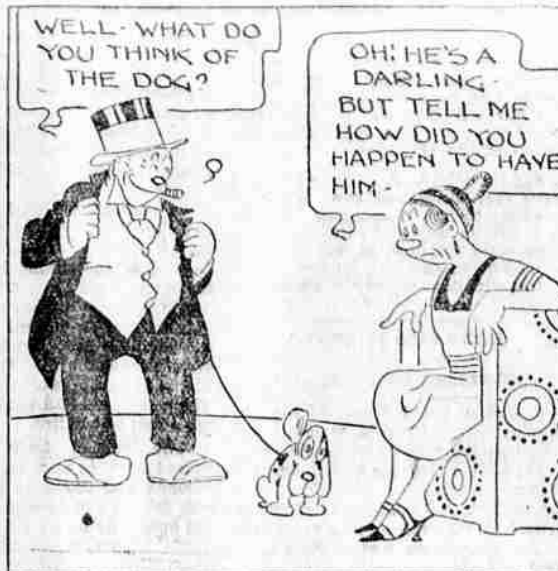


## BRINGING UP FATHER

Wire Report On  
Foreign Money

LONDON, Aug. 24.—(By the Associated Press)—The German mark took another downward plunge today and touched \$600 to the pound; sterling on heavy selling by speculators, who were disappointed at the failure of the allied mission to secure guarantees from Germany.

NEW YORK, Aug. 24.—Reported failure of the reparations commission to reach an agreement with the German government, combined with disquieting cable dispatches regarding political and economic conditions in Germany today caused another sharp collapse in German exchange. Marks which have been steadily declining for the last two months, were quoted at 5 1/2 cents a hundred, or approximately 20 cents for a mark. The normal or pre-war price of the mark was 25 1/2 cents each.

French francs also sank to the franc's lowest level, being quoted at 16 cents each. Slight precautions were taken to place in demand sterling and other European remittances.
