LAWLESSNESS AND INDIFFERENCE.

WHEN Attorney General Daugherty declared the other day, there was a widespread attempt on the part of American bolsheviks, I. W. W.'s, radicals, et cetera, to take advantage of the railroad strike, for a reign of terror, few people took the statement seriously.

There has been so much talk about Bolsheviki, so many cries of "Wolf," and so little concrete evidence of serious trouble, that the people as a whole, have been inclined to maintain an attitude of indifference toward this peril, as toward many others.

But the report from Chicago that three striking shopmen on the Michigan Central railroad have confessed to wrecking the Million Dollar Express, resulting in two deaths, and many injuries, can scarcely fail to awaken the people to the reality of the crisis.

It now appears there was also a plot to wreck the Twentieth Century Limited near Elkhart Indiana, while arrests in various parts of the country, show a wide-spread conspiracy to enlist strikers in a red revolution, looking toward seizure of government property.

Of course as far as organized labor is concerned, this lawlessness undoubtedly represents a decided minority. But it is a very active minority. It is a minority, which to date, has met with little opposition on the part of the labor rank and file itself.

The time has come when American labor should clean its own house not only for the good of the country, but for its own good. Standing on the indefensible principle that a worker who does not belong to a union, thereby deprives himself of his constitutional rights and is legitimate prey for professional thugs and brick throwing mobs, is the sort of thing which gives these undesirables a working basis for their anarchical propaganda.

Respect for the law, obedience to the law, on the part of all citizens, high, low, rich or poor on this ground and this ground alone can ultimate disaster in this country be prevented. Make an exception in one case and the gates are let down for exceptions in all cases. Only uncompromising and unqualified obedience to law and order supported by awakened public sentiment, can solve the problems which threaten American security.

IRISH REPUBLICANS FIRE ON MOURNERS AT COLLINS' FUNERAL

BELFAST, Aug. 29.—(By the Associated Press)—Republican irregulars fired upon a congregation of mourners yesterday as they were leaving a Westport, county Mayo, church, having attended mass in honor of Michael Collins, says a message received today by the Athlone correspondent for the Belfast Telegraph Union.

The correspondent said the Athlone military headquarters was without official knowledge of the reported shooting, but the unofficial message stated that five civilians were killed and several others wounded.

The republicans fired at the worshippers from across a river, the message said and men, women and children fled in all directions as volley after volley was poured in their direction. Troops vigorously replied to the firing and a stiff engagement ensued after the arrival of reinforcements but the republicans were finally driven from the town.
