Extending Sixth street under the tracks would not only provide necessary fire protection, but would be a great benefit in a business way, and in the solution of the important problem of lessening traffic congestion on Main street.

Medford is growing. The automobile traffic is increasing tremendously. Blocking Main street during business hours, even for five or ten minutes is a great annoyance to people of the city and its frequency seems to be increasing. When added to this we have a positive menace in case of fire, and the necessity of radical change in the lines of communication across the S. P. tracks becomes of immediate and serious concern.
