For having two quarts of booze in his possession on the streets of this city Oscar Wal, a Swedish laborer of Gold Hill, drew a fine of \$250 and costs in Judge Taylor's court this forenoon. This fine will probably be raised by Gold Hill friends cooperating, at least it was so announced in court after the sentence.

This heavy penalty was imposed by Judge Taylor in an effort by the authorities to break up the band of "boozers" who have for some time been coming to Medford, drinking and quarrelling hereabouts, and raising ned generally in rooming houses in the business district. A number of the out of town drinkers have been fined in the past for intoxication, but without result. They always protected the bootleggers who furnished them with the moonshine.

The local authorities have long been looking for an opportunity to break up this drinking here from out of town, and hence yesterday when Constable Sandifer found Wal on the street with two quarts of moonshine in his possession, he was eagerly gobbled in, and in court today was given the big fine. Wal is regarded here as the go between, who has been the agent between the bootleggers and the Gold Hill boozers.
