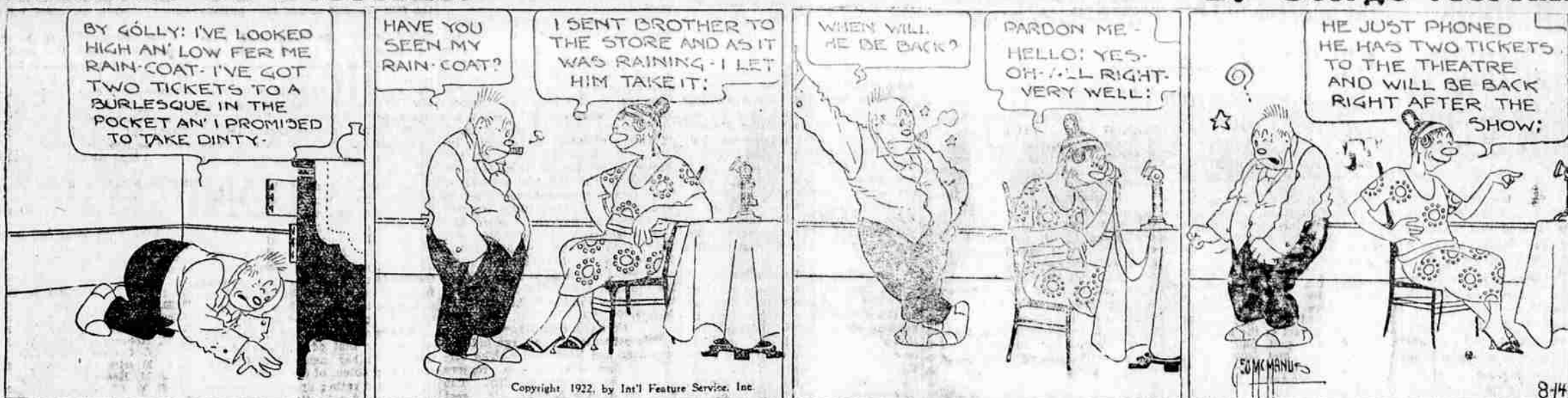

EPISCOPALIANS CONDEMN COMP. SCHOOL ACTION

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 19.—Raffles, gambling and gambling devices are repugnant to God's law and should not be tolerated in the church, according to a resolution adopted today by the house of deputies of the Protestant Episcopal church in general convention here.

Opposition to legislation which would put church schools out of business was declared in a resolution adopted today by the house of deputies. This resolution offered by the Rev. Dr. A. B. Kinsolving of Baltimore declared that while the church recognized the importance of the public schools and the necessity of using the English language, it regarded the church schools as indispensable and deprecated all efforts in nation and in the states directed against religious schools.

A resolution declaring sympathy for the families of the miners who lost their lives in the Argonaut mine disaster and expressing the hope that provisions be made so workers in the future may not be subjected to similar danger was introduced in the house of deputies today by Rev. J. T. MacGovern of Vallejo, Cal. It was referred to the committee on social service. Prayers of sympathy for the families of the dead miners were said at noon.

Special Conclave to Give the President 33d Masonic Degree
