FORD HAS ONLY STARTED FIGHT **MUSCLE SHOALS**

DETROIT, Mich., Oct. 12 .- (By As sociated Press). Renewal of the lease under which the Alabama Power company operates the government's electrical generating steam plant at Muscle Shoals has no bearing what-ever on the offer of Henry Ford to over and operate the Shoals property, nor has it any bearing on the status of that offer, officials of the Ford Motor company said today. Representatives of Mr. Ford reiter ated today previous statements credit ed to the manufacturer that he had only begun his fight to obtain contro of Muscle Shoals.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12.-Renewal for another year of the lease under which the Alabama Power company operates the government electrical generating steam plant at Muscle Shoals was announced today by Secretary Weeks.

The contract was renewed on th same terms as originally negotiated, a step which Secretary Weeks said wa necessary to "enable a number of cot ton mills and other industries in states including North and South Carolina to continue operations which otherwise would be compelled to close down or materially curtail production because of disturbed conditions in coal and transportation industries and lack of developed hydro-electric power.
