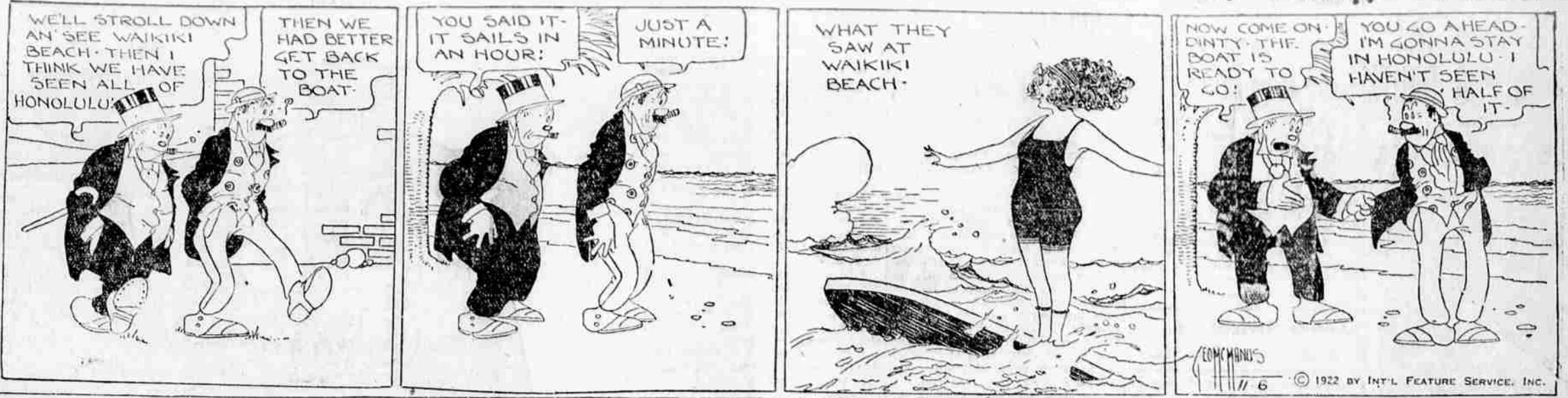

BOND ISSUE FOR MARKET HIGHWAY GIVEN SUPPORT

A week ago Judge Gardner spoke at the Chamber of Commerce forum and reviewed the road work that had been accomplished during the past by means of county, state and federal funds. He called attention to the necessity of completing the one road that means more to the Rogue River valley in a commercial way than any other, being the road leading to Klamath and Lake counties.

It will take some \$75,000 to complete this and as Klamath county has had contracts let for this road connecting up the same at the Jackson county line it behooves us to see that our portion of the road is built. The state highway commission will cooperate in this on a fifty-fifty basis.

Whenever so-called state roads are completed, the state highway commission assumes responsibility in maintaining them. When this road to Klamath Falls is finished and the bridge at Gold Hill is completed, the state then will pay all maintenance cost.

In considering the forum recommendation the directors investigated the possible effect the \$100,000 bond issue would have on the completion of the Crater Lake highway. Upon being assured that sufficient funds remain to complete this highway the directors of the Medford Chamber of Commerce took the same action that was taken by the Ashland Chamber and endorsed the bond issue as a necessary means to complete two highways and relieve the county of the expense of repairs to same.

In taking this action the directors took into consideration that this bond issue will not increase taxes as \$100,000 bonds will be retired in 1923 and if the bonds fail to carry that the county authorities would have to complete the road out of general road funds leaving the county without means to do any work of the Butte Falls and other roads improvement work now partially completed.
