## PINCHOT VICTOR IN RACE, GOVERNOR, DEMOCRATIC GAINS

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 9.—Gifford Pinchot, Pennsylvania's republican governor-elect, planned to slip out of the city for a few days rest and, he announced, to study his plans for a new state budget and for a state government re-organization scheme to be presented to the legislature.

Late returns indicated that Mr. Pinchot's plurality was increasing as remote regions of the state were heard from. Figures received from 7560 of the 8021 districts in the state gave him 795,969 votes to 539,577 for John A. McSparran, his democratic opponent, a lead of 255,392.

The returns showed that the democratic candidate carried 27 of the 67 counties.

Major David A. Reed, republican, elected to the United States senate for the full term beginning next March, led his democratic opponent, Judge Samuel E. Shull, by 359,039 votes in 7269 of the districts. The figures were Reed 742,276; Shull 383,239.

George Wharton Pepper, republican, present United States senator, who was elected to fill the unexpired term of the late Senator Hoies Penrose, had a lead of 331,341 over Fred B. Kerr, the democratic candidate in returns from 7394 districts. The figures were Pepper 753,577; Kerr 422,256.

Unofficial returns indicated that the democrats gained six congressmen in Pennsylvania giving them a delegation of seven and that they also had increased their representation in the legislature.

## LUTHERAN PASTOR 'DRY AS VOLSTEAD' CONGRESS CHOICE

ST. PAUL, Nov. 9.—Only one congressional seat in Minnesota was undecided today—that in the eighth district, where Representative Oscar J. Larsen, republican, was leading William L. Carsa, democrat, with slightly more than half the district heard from.

Many of the precincts in the eighth district are scattered throughout the north woods section in northeastern Minnesota and reports are slow in coming in. Returns from 211 precincts out of 499 gave Larsen 22,995 and Carsa 20,269.

ST. PAUL, Nov. 9.—Rev. O. J. Kvale, of Benson, Minn., elected congressman over Congressman Volstead in the seventh district, is pastor of a Norwegian Lutheran church in that town. He was born February 6, 1869 near Decorah, Iowa. After attending schools, he went to Luther college at Decorah, graduated in 1890, and then attended Luther seminary, graduating in 1893. He afterwards studied at the University of Chicago, taking the M. A. degree at that institution and has been Lutheran minister for the past 28 years.

Rev. Kvale received the endorsement of the farmer-labor and democratic party district conventions. Prohibition was not an issue in the seventh district when Kvale filed, and he stated he is "as dry as Volstead, with possibly a little to spare."

Mr. Kvale is a member of the boards of education and finance of the

Norwegian Lutheran church of America.
