Great Treat for Music Lovers at Presbyterian Church Sunday

The music lovers of this city have a great treat in store for them at the Presbyterian church on Sunday night. The musicians are James H. Shearer, the celebrated Scottish concert organist and Mrs. J. H. Shearer (formerly Miss Annie Strubbe) a wonderful Canadian soprano. James H. He carries the highest credentials from Widor of Paris, and Schadowenka of Berlin, and is highly recommended by the press. 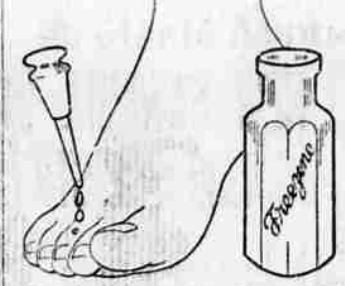
