George A. White, adjutant general of Oregon, points out the fact, in an article in this month's issue of the Pacific Legion, that fully 2500 Oregon soldiers and sailors failed to apply for either a cash bonus or loan before the time limit for applications had expired.

General White proposes a number of changes in the bonus law administration, among them abolition of the World war veterans state aid commission of which he is a member. This commission has general supervision of the administration of the law. He wants in its place a salaried commissioner. An advisory board of three persons is proposed for settling general questions of policy. Ex-service men should be allowed to return their cash bonus and secure the loan, he states. The time limit for applications should be extended to December 31, 1923.
