NEW HOTEL FOR ASHLAND AGAIN UP FOR ACTION

ASHLAND, Dec. 6.—The annual meeting of the life members of the Southern Oregon Chautauqua association with headquarters at Ashland, Oregon, is called for 8 p. m., Monday, December 11, in Chautauqua Pioneer hall, Ashland, Ore., for the purpose of electing officers and to consider the matter of the disposition of the holdings of the association, with certain reservations for holding the annual Chautauqua sessions, and such other business as may lawfully come before the meeting. Southern Oregon Oregon Chautauqua Association, by W. Judson Oldfield, president. The foregoing is supposed to apply to a proposition looking towards the Chautauqua grounds, or a portion thereof at least, being utilized for the big new hotel site. This is conjectural, however, and the item must be qualified by the customary precautionary safeguards to the effect that "it is reported," "They say," etc. The site is a commanding one, far surpassing the location of the fine new Civic clubhouse on the tide flats of Ashland creek, contiguous to sheds, creameries and garages. If the new hotel is erected on this site, it is planned to have it face both on Main street and Pioneer avenue, affording a wide range of the town's perspective. It is understood that the new clubhouse might have been located in this locality, utilizing Chautauqua Pioneer hall as a nucleus for its structure, but the fine view available was offset by the more convenient accessibility of the Park street site, in affording a roadway by its doors leading direct to the park area, also supplying a handier refuge for wearied tourist parents and their infants.

The Park garage, one of the well-known Peil properties very conveniently located on Park avenue, is removing to a location in Hotel Ashland annex recently vacated. Peil announces that incident to this change, however, the old headquarters have already been leased to other parties.

Activities at the Presbyterian church will be worked overtime this week, especially on Friday which date will signalize gatherings of the Juniors of the Christian Endeavor, the Westminster Guild, and the Ladies' Aid, the latter organization holding an all-day session, incorporating a peak load of sewing work in connection with social hours.

In spite of counter attractions the last of the week, the dance at Jackson Hot Springs was liberally patronized last Saturday night, a worthy incentive being the benefit accompaniment in behalf of charitable objects.

During Winter Fair week some notable bargains are being offered by local merchants as specials, one instance cited relating to the spud market, whereby Yakima potatoes, heretofore retailing at \$2, are offered at \$1.50 per hundred pounds. Corresponding reductions are being made by all other lines of business to the extent of affording purchasing opportunities worth the while as applying to necessities as well as luxuries. These bargain conditions will prevail up to and including Friday of this week.

After a fortnight's respite following the Thanksgiving season, student athletic stunts will assume the basketball craze in lieu of the football phase relegated to obscurity for the time being. Possibly a champion game might be negotiated between the Ashland-Medford high schools.

Hal Urdahl, author, lecturer and teacher, is conducting a series of free lectures at the Civic club house, revealing "The Key of Knowledge," as applied to various phases of character, intellectual development. After each lecture an "inspirational and healing silence" will be conducted. The meetings continue from Dec. 6 to 12 inclusive, and although the seances are free, a silver collection will be in order.

H. Vaupey.

Burdick as president, Grace Putnam, vice-president, and John F. Leggett, teacher. This class promises to become one of the most successful auxiliaries of the church.
